#### MAY PROGRAM: SOUTH PACIFIC DESTINATIONS



## CALIFORNIA ABALONE



THE FOLLOWING IS AN EXCERPT FROM THE LEAFLET CALIFORNIA ABALONE BY PETER L. HAAKER, KRISTINE C. HENDERSON, AND DAVID O. PARKER.

MARINE RESOURCES LEAFLET No. 11

#### INTRODUCTION

Abalone have lived along the Pacific coast for millions of years. Fossilized shells closely resembling modern abalone have been found in sediments approximately 100 million years old. In more recent times abalone were important in the economy of all native peoples who dwelled in California's coastal areas.

Indians were using abalone for food, implements and decoration long before the arrival of Europeans in North America, The present commercial fishery began in the mid-nineteenth century, and peaked at an annual harvest of over five million pounds in 1957. Thereafter, about four million were harvested annually until 1969 when a serious decline began. The decline has continued and in some places the fishery has disappeared altogether.

Recreational interest in abalone increased when wetsuits,

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#### JADE COVE CAMP OUT

Jade Cove is 40 miles south of Big Sur and 40 miles north of San Simeon. It is noted for loose chunks of nephrite jade at and below the water line. It is real jade but of poor grade so it is not worth much. Once one finds a nice size specimen, jade fever usually takes over. And you can have 3 days to find some!

DIRECTIONS — It is approximately 5–6 hours driving from the South Bay area to Plaskett Creek. Go north on 101 thru Santa Barbara to San Luis Obispo. Exit at the Hwy 1 offramp for Morrro Bay head north to San Simeon. Twenty nine miles past San Simeon you will pass through a very small town called Gorda. Look for the Plaskett Creek

campground sign on the east side of Hwy 1 about  $2^{1}/_{2}$ -3 miles north of Gorda.

WHAT TO DO — The diving at Jade Cove is noted for its beauty in addition to its gems. There are large lingcod and other rock fish for the gamesman. Usually there is a thick kelp bed to cope with and conditions can be harsh and variable. The hike to the beach is through 100 yards of meadow land and down a 150' cliff along a steep switch—back dirt trail. For those not wanting to cope with the cliff, several miles up north is Willow Creek where you can drive down to the beach. It is a sandy beach entry with rocky patches out further that are great for the photographer and the browser. The fresh water from the creek is a highlight too. Other things to do besides diving are hiking, photography, bird watching, volleyball, catching up on R&R and meeting fellow club members. On Saturday, the 2ND there will be a Pot Luck dinner and on Sunday night there will be a traditional 4TH of July dinner (but on the 3RD!) — hamburgers, hot dogs, chips, beans, etc. Sign-ups for what items people want to bring will be at the May and June general meetings.

CAMPSITE & FEES — The club has reserved group campsite #3 on the southeast end of the campground. It can accommodate 50 people and 8 parking slots. The campsite is designed for tents and there are tables, stoves, firepits, vault toilets, and drinking water. No showers are available in this area. Camping fee is \$8.00 for members and \$10.00 for non-members, children are free. Checks are to be made out to TRW Sea Divers. Cancellation notice must be given 7 days before July 1 (June 24) to Joe or Kathy Kalohi with a confirmed acknowledgment of your call in order to receive a refund.

WHAT TO BRING — Camping gear, cooking utensils, warm clothing for the evening, full diving gear, firewood, hiking boots, abalone iron (to move gravel in your search for jade), small diving light, and as many tanks as you would like to dive with. The nearest air station is 55 miles south in Cayucos at Bill's Sporting Goods. There are small stores in Gorda or 2 miles north of the campground for ice, gas, etc.

diving equipment, individually owned boats, and charter boats became readily available. Although harvests have remained high in some areas, particularly in northren California, many other areas are no longer productive.

The state of the resource today is a cause for concern by many interests, including the Department of Fish and Game. Commercial demand is high while the supply is decreasing. Recreational divers often must travel further or search harder for a limit, or a trophy size abalone. Large areas of once productive habitat have been depleted by a variety of causes. Nevertheless, California's abalone species still possess an almost legendary mystique.




#### CLASSIFICATION

In the animal kingdom, abalone belong to the phylum Mollusca, a group which includes clams, scallops, sea slugs, octopuses, and squids, Molluscs are world-wide and predominantly marine, They have a soft body surrounded by a mantle, an anterior head, and a large, muscular foot. Molluscs are best known for their beautifully formed and colored shell secreted by the mantle.

The abalone join the snails, whelks, and sea slugs in the class Gastropoda. Members of this class have one shell, as opposed to clams with two, or the shell may be lacking altogether, as in the sea slugs. The spiral structure, so common in snail shells is flattened in the abalone and may be obscured by fouling and shell boring organisms.

Abalone are members of the family Haliotidae and the genus Haliotis, which means sea ear, referring to the flattened shape of the shell, The name abalone is probably derived from the Spanish-American word aulon or aulone.



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

Our first two day (Friday/Saturday) of 1988 is on the Peace out of Ventura Marina to the /Channel Islands. The PEACE is 65' long, 22' wide, and has 3000 psi air fills, color TV/VCR, sundeck and of course the famous hot tub. The crew is great and Bill goes out of his way to make the PEACE one of the best boats around.

We will work our way out from Ventura making dives at SANTA CRUZ and SANTA ROSA on the first day. Both islands are known for their abundance of game. Large red ABALONE can be found in large numbers, as can good size FISH. The pinnacles and reefs provide homes for SCALLOPS and superior spots for PHOTOGRAPHERS. Depending on our progress and weather we will end the first day with an evening twilight or night dive at SAN MIGUEL. We will probably overnight on the north side of San Miguel We will socialize and party a little during the overnight stay, as we did on last year's September trip, giving the hot tub a good work out in the process. Dinner will include several varieties of wine, for those wishing to participate!

Depending on weather conditions the second day we could make a run at WILSON'S, ROCK which is about one mile from Cuyler's. WILSON'S is an exposed dive spot with a series of spectacular underwater reefs at

depths varying from 20' to in excess of 120' in the adjacent canyons. The dive is just spectacular and obviously is great for game and PHOTOGRAPHY. We also plan to dive LITTLE WILSON'S, which is in the channel between SAN MIGUEL AND SANTA ROSA. This pinnacle and reef structure rises to within 35' of the surface and drops to about 90' in the surrounding area. We dived this spot last year and it is one of the most beautiful dives around - huge SCALLOPS too! We will then work our way back along SANTA ROSA/SANTA CRUZ making at least one more dive.

For those who just like to cruise part or all of the way, There is no better boat or trip than this one. We will also fill the trip with other goodies including prizes - game, booby and sign-in, fun and socializing, following in the footsteps of our last two day dives. Those who sign-up and pay in full by 22 April 1988 will also be eligible for a drawing for a single day boat dive.

The PEACE is an extremely popular boat and this trip is almost full as of writing. ### JUNE TWO DAY BOAT DIVE

19/20 JUNE 1988

#### BEGG ROCK/SAN NICHOLAS/SANTA BARBARA WILD WAVE

MEMBERS \$144

**NON-MEMBERS** 

Our second two-day dive this year is an outer island cruise and dive to the best spots in the Southern area. This is a Sunday/ Monday affair, and has all the makings of a really great trip. The WILD WAVE is the fastest boat in the local fleet, is 65' long, 20' wide, cruises at 15 knots, and has 3 hot showers, a full galley, game storage tank, and a safety recall system. Mickey and John know the best spots on all the islands, and the deck hands are very helpful and friendly. The boat is berthed at 22nd Street in San Pedro.

We will have at least two chances at BEGG ROCK which is a group of pinnacles that rise about 15' above water and plunge in the most spectacular fashion to over 100' with rolling ledges from 30' to 60'. It is located about 7 miles North of SAN NICHOLAS. and is noted for its huge plate sized SCALLOPS - easy to limit out at the 2 day limit of 20. Photophiles will be in seventh heaven, as visibility is usually excellent. Relative beginners should note that BEGG ROCK is exposed to the mood of the ocean, but may be dived by all skill levels after appropriate pre-dive consultation with the divemasters and a properly planned dive.

SAN NICHOLAS the outermost island, and is noted for it's remoteness and large size game. The ocean temperature will be coming up in the yearly cycle making diving very pleasant. We should also have no problem reaching limits (8 for 2 days) of ABALONE - pinks, greens, and reds. Also large FISH such as Calico Bass, Sheephead, etc., etc.. Even if you don't limit out you won't come home empty handed! We will overnight at SAN NICHOLAS, with dinner, several varieties of wine for those interested (?) and good friends, making for a great evening. Those of you who were on last year's trip I'm sure will remember what a great time we had - we plan to repeat it! The following day we will either head for BEGG ROCK for a second attempt or cruise to SANTA BARBARA Island, which is the smallest, prettiest island, and has a little of everything. The spectacular underwater arches, walls, reefs, and sea lions are great for PHOTOGRAPHERS, and visibility is usually very good. If you didn't limit out on ABALONE at SAN NICHOLAS, then you should complete your catch at SANTA BARBARA - mostly pinks, greens and a smattering of WHITES. Again large FISH surround the area, including black sea bass (for viewing only)!

In our now established two-day tradition, several prizes will be awarded during this trip. These will include a prize for game; a drawing of your sign-in number; a booby prize and for those who sign up and pay in full by 20 May 1988 a special drawing for half the price of the trip. Our two day trips are really fun - ask anyone who has been on one recently(!) and they are a great way to get to know other divers in the club. We are limiting the trip to only 20 divers, so sign up early to make sure you have a spot. Call Mike (McLaughlin) at (213) 374-4698 or Allen (Parker) at (213) 536-2614 for information or inputs to the dive Boarding begins at 9:00 PM on Saturday 18 June for a midnight departure. Be there!



- A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club.
- A club member will have a confirmed reservation on an upcoming dive only if:
  - A check in the full amount for the dive has been received by the dive boat reservationist, or The club member has a deposit on file with the club and makes a telephone request for a reservation with the dive boat reservationist. (Deposit is presently \$40 and will be \$50 for new deposits after 6/30/88.)
- Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible to provide paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for
- If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure any additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only TRW club members and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive.
