





### **OUR PREMIUM TWO DAY BOAT DIVE**

19/20 MAY 1989 MEMBERS \$155 WILSON'S ROCK/SAN MIGUEL/SANTA ROSA (INCLUDES FOOD AND AIR)

PEACE NON-MEMBERS \$170

Our first two day (Friday/Saturday) of 1989 is once more on the PEACE out of Ventura Marina to the Channel Islands. The PEACE is 65' long, 22' wide, 3000 psi air fills, large galley, color TV/VCR, sun deck, bunks with lights, and now air conditioning, and of course the famous hot tub. The crew is great and Bill (Magee) goes out of his way to make the PEACE one of the best boats around.

We will work our way out from Ventura making dives primarily at SANTA ROSA on the first day. Red ABALONE can be found in large numbers, as can good size FISH including halibut this time of year. The pinnacles and reefs provide homes for SCALLOPS and superior spots for PHOTOGRAPHERS. Depending on our progress and weather we will end the first day with one or two dives at SAN MIGUEL, including an evening twilight or night dive. We will socialize and party "some" during the overnight stay, giving the hot tub a good work out in the process. The full dinner will include several varieties of club provided wine, for those wishing to participate!

Depending on weather conditions the second day, we anticipate a run at WILSON'S ROCK which is about one mile from Cuyler's. Last year on this dive we were successful! WILSON'S is an exposed dive spot with a series of spectacular underwater reefs at depths varying from 20' to in excess of 120' in the adjacent canyons. The dive is just spectacular and obviously is great for game and PHOTOGRAPHY. We also plan to dive LITTLE WILSON'S, which is in the channel between SAN MIGUEL and SANTA ROSA. This pinnacle and reef structure rises to within 35' of the surface and drops to over 90' in the immediate surrounding area. We have now dived this spot several times, over the past two years, and it is one of the most beautiful dives around – huge SCALLOPS too! We will then work our way back along SANTA ROSA making at least one more dive.

We will also add to the trip with other goodies including prizes, fun and socializing, following in the footsteps of our two day dives over the past two or three years. Those who sign-up and pay in full by 21 April 1989 will also be eligible for a drawing for a single day all inclusive boat dive.

For those of you who just like to cruise part or all the of the way, there is no better boat or trip than this one. The PEACE is an extremely popular boat with the club and this is filling very early. ### SINGLE DAY WRECK DIVE "AVALON" AND "VALIANT" WRECKS/ CATALINA FRONTSIDE (INCLUDES FOOD AND AIR)

BOLD CONTENDER

MEMBERS \$52

NON-MEMBERS \$59

This dive features a variety of activities and is also our lowest priced all inclusive charter for 1989. We will be taking the BOLD CONTENDER from Ports O' Call, departing at 06:30 AM, and running up the Palos Verdes coast to the site of the "AVALON" wreck to make our first dive. (The events leading up to the wreck in 1961 are described elsewhere in the Newsletter). The "AVALON' lies in about 70 feet of water and usually has good visibility. Quite large FISH inhabit both the bow and stern sections, and PHOTOGRAPHERS or just looky-loos will not be disappointed. Made to order breakfasts will be served before and after this first dive.

We will then cruise over to the Avalon area of CATALINA where we will dive the wreck of the "VALIANT". (Again the events leading up to the wreck in 1930 are described elsewhere in the Newsletter). The "VALIANT" lies a little deeper with the stern at about 80 feet and the bow at 90 + feet. The wreck is visually and PHOTOGRAPHICALLY beautiful and one can still make out the large diesel engines, pumps and with a little searching the infamous gasoline generator, apparent cause of the fire.

Following our "VALIANT" dive, we will make one or two shallow dives on the frontside of CATALINA on some of the spectacular reefs North of Avalon. We will then cruise back to Ports O' Call and partake of a heavy duty late lunch, typical BOLD CONTENDER style, including club provided wine.

Other activities on this charter will include a shore boat into Avalon for those non-divers or divers who wish to spend an hour or two on shore. On boat and diving activities are going to be video-taped(!) and snorkelers/skin divers will have an opportunity to do their thing on the shallow dives. We are also going to allow a small number of additional bubble watchers on board (a kind of Sea Divers "take me along with you"). For those divers needing help or confidence building on deep diving there will be a short discussion on the particular dive/conditions/wreck facts and if necessary an advanced diver, diversater, or instructor will be assigned to one or more less experienced divers for their dive.

Weather conditions excepted, these wreck dives are suitable for all levels of experience - however, know your limits.

Call Micheal (Borden) at (213) 372-7764 for sign-up or Allen (Parker) at (213) 813-5383 for information/additional details of the dive. The Bold Contender is at berth 76 in Ports O' Call and boarding the evening before, Friday 14 April, will be available. Everyone should be on board by 6:20 AM on the 15th, for a prompt 6:30 AM departure. SEE YOU THERE!


