FOREST IN THE SEA

Our film explores the amazing underwater world of the great kelp forests that stretch from the deep Pacific to our California coast. 

The mighty CHARISMA will take us from 22nd Street to FARNSWORTH BANKS and other pinnacles and reefs on the back and front side of CATALINA. This will be our first scheduled dive to FARNSWORTH since June 1990 and will probably not be scheduled again until 1994!

FARNSWORTH BANKS is on the back side of CATALINA about 1.3 miles off Ben Western Point. The banks are about 1100 yards by 600 yards, with the shallowest pinnacles at 55 to 70 feet. The spectacular walls descend to over 100 feet. FARNSWORTH is famous for its now protected unique coral which is the deep purple color contrasting with other colonies of coral, such as at SANTA BARBARA, which tend to be pink, red or orange. Some of the colonies of coral are over 15 inches in diameter, and the whole visual effect adds immeasurably to the beauty of FARNSWORTH, both to the eye and the lens of your camera, still PHOTO and/or VIDEO. Large FISH, which are not protected, inhabit the area so you spear folks should collect a nice bounty.

This is a spectacular dive and under perfect conditions can be dived by all except beginners. Under less than perfect conditions, this is an advanced dive. However, following the FARNSWORTH dive we will proceed to at least three other shallower pinnacles or reefs, suitable for all skill levels, around the West End of CATALINA. Although not as abundant as on the other islands, SCALLOPS and ABALONE are available to the persistent gameperson.

As is now typical of all Sea Divers charters, the trip includes air, food, snacks, beverages (leaded and unleaded), and an award or two to keep things interesting on board! Our overnight spot will again depend on the prevailing weather conditions but as always on our SAN MIGUEL area trips, if the weather cooperates we will also take in WILSON ROCK in lieu lesser dive spots!

WILD WAVE ROUGHS ANOTHER ONE

The WILD WAVE charter Sunday, 15 March, to Santa Barbara Island provided some advanced diving opportunities! The forecasted storm passed through during our night run from 22nd Street to the Island, and by the time we anchored off the northwest tip, in about 80 feet of water, the ocean was up. There were 8-10 foot swells with chop up to 4-5 feet. Once off the surface, things got better with 80 feet of visibility and a suprisingly comfortable high 50's temperature. Current was minimal but even at 70-80 feet, the swells could be noted on the depth gauge!! Getting back to and back onto the boat was sporty to difficult, but on this first dive most were prudent and approached the step from underwater. Those few who did not, had significant difficulty getting back to the boat.

For the second dive we moved about one mile south and shallower (50-60 feet) water. Surge City!!!. Surprisingly, however, visibility was still 50-60 feet. Pink (yes pink!) abs were clustered on small rock formations; however, picking off two legal sized in the surge was a real challenge. The boat was also dragging anchor off the reef, so when the last two divers surfaced they were about a quarter mile from the boat . . . surprise, surprise!!! By now there were some swell/wave sets coming through at 12-14 feet, so sanity set in and we motored between Sutil Island and the southwest tip of Santa Barbara into calmer seas.

The third dive was much more comforatable in up to 50 feet of 30-40 foot visibility, within a thick kelp bed. Ideal rock pile bug houses were everywhere, but they were not home in most cases. The fourth and final dive was about one quarter mile east of the third dive in quite similar conditions and with even less discomfort, allowing all our divers to make at least two dives or up to four for the advanced folks.

What was the take?? Quite a few abalone with several limits (all of two!!!) of mostly pinks; a passel of fish by just two divers; and a smattering of bugs including John Mowrey's HUGE 12-13 pounder for which he picked off the dive light prize we've been carrying for TWO full lobster seasons for the first 8 pounder!!?

The run back to 22nd Street was uneventful with steak, baked potatoes, corn, salad, dessert, cookies, wine, beer, etc., etc. A real pig-out. As we approached the dock we awarded John M his \$50 trophy and skipper Joel I his award for 1991 Skipper of the Year. We elected not to make a booby award as it would have been too embarassing —figure that one out divers!! All in all, it was a good trip, albeight a rough day out and our full load enjoyed —well most!??

The campground has been reserved from Thursday through Sunday (2–5 July). The cost will be a flat rate of \$15 per person.


We must have 10 paid sign-ups no later than 1 June or the trip will be cancelled.


BEACH DIVE TIME

17 MAY - VETERAN'S PARK, REDONDO BEACH

DIVING - REFRESHER COURSE - BOUILLABAISSE COOKOUT / POTLUCK

We will dive just south of the pier at Redondo adjacent to Veteran's Park. For those unfamiliar with the dive site, it offers an easy sandy beach entry and the surf is typically small due to the Redondo Canyon at this location. Following a sloping sand bottom, the diver encounters the old Redondo Pier pilings about 50 feet out. They stand above the sand bottom reaching 10 feet and more toward the surface. Their long submersion leaves them covered with red corinactus and hollowed out havens for crabs. Continuing further, the pilings end in about 80 feet of water over the edge of the Redondo Canyon. Anyone requiring a short "refresher" in diving should contact Ken Sizemore for appropriate arrangements. Park in the Redondo Beach Municipal parking lot on the south side of Veteran's Park at 25 cents an hour (bring quarters!!!!).

Grande Master Chef Parker will again be stirring up a warm and filling pot or more of bouillabaisse that is guaranteed to satisfy the most discriminating diver. "Le Chef" asks all who plan to partake of this tasty concotion to bring SEAFOOD, CAUGHT OR OR BOUGHT, TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE POT. Crusty bread will be provided, but bring your own beverages, other accompaniments and a potluck if you are not into bouillabaisse! . . . more for the rest of us.

Wild Wave/Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive; go to the left on to Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.

 B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment
- in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.

 C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full
- is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.

 D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only Sea Diver club members and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.


