
Another potentially great trip on the PEACE -- this time with a Sea Diver U/W photo competition thrown in! For the trip we are heading for San Miguel Island which hopefully will include at least one run at Wilson Rock.

After leaving Ventura Marina we will head out on the lee side of Santa Cruz and Santa Rosa Islands to make our first dive in or around the Santa Cruz Channel. Then working our way long Santa Rosa Island and into the San Miguel Passage crossing to San Miguel in the late morning timeframe.

Depending on weather and ocean conditions, we will dive the north and/or south side of the island, hopefully to include Wychoff Ledge, Crook Point, Cardwell Point, Bay Point and Harris Point – either on the first day or following a Wilson Rock dive on the second day.

Needless to ay San Miguel/Wilson Rock is dived and/or fished less than the other islands and their game, including large scallops, abalone (mostly reds) and a variety of fish, is significantly more plentiful. Photo competitors will have many opportunities for that winning shot. Looky-loos will not be disappointed. Although some of the dives, including Wilson Rock, typically require intermediate to advanced skills, many dives can be made by all skill levels — ocean permitting!!

PEACE two-day dives are always fun filled which supplements the diving experiences — don't miss this great September outing. 

BUG SEASON ALREADY?!? This year the season opener again begins Saturday, 2 October 1993, instead of Wednesday, 6 October 1993. This Friday dive occurs six days after the opener. The "San Nicolas Express" will leave Cabrillo Marina at 12:01 AM for a fast run to the Island for an early AM night dive. Don't forget your dive light, backup and NEW chem lights. We hope to make four or five dives, depending on weather, dive spots, success (or failure!) and diver ocean time. Quick in, quick out makes for more dives, more spots and more BUGS?!? SAN NICOLAS can still provide the big LOBSTER, with FISH and SCALLOPS as back up once you've made your BUG limit of seven !?#@?!!

Last year we did "drift diving" with some real success -- netting 29 bugs in all. Ocean permitting, we'll try that technique again this year and see if we can increase that take (obviously don't count on me!!).

This dive is a destination change from that listed previously (was to Santa Barbara) and thus the November dive will be to Santa Barbara in lieu of San Nicolas.

Come join The Sea Divers on our 2-day trip to Wilson Rock and San Miguel Island on September 10-11 for our not-so-annual u/w photo competition. It's been a while since we had an intra-club photo competition, which is a shame, 'cause we have plenty of talented "photophiles" in the club. It's always been alot of fun, so what the hell, let's do it again!

This time, however, we're going to do it a little differently. Instead of having a totally open competition where a great local shot taken last month can be blown away by a super-visibility tropical shot taken in Fiji last year, we want everyone to have a chance at the top prize(s). To do so, we're going to have the competition limited to shots taken on the September two day trip. To make it even fairer, the entries must come from shots taken from one roll of color slide film, issued by the club to each u/w photographer at the beginning of the event. The club will collect the exposed rolls from each diver at the end of the event and will have them processed at AB Sea Photo. The processed slides will be returned to each participant who will have until the next club meeting (October 5th) to select a maximum of two "gems" per category as entries for the competition. Entries and winning photos will be will be presented at a special slide show during the November meeting (November 2nd).

Prizes will be awarded for the top shots in three categories: marine life, the diver, and macro photography. Allen Broder at AB Sea Photo has agreed to pseudo-sponsor the event and is donating 16×20 , 11×14 , and 8×10 Cibachrome prints as prizes (over \$100.00 value). The club will also chip in with a free one-day boat trip as well as other prizes and awards. You can also rent u/w photo gear from AB Sea Photo (including the new Nikonos RS) to use for the event if you don't have your own.

The entry fee will be \$20.00, approximately two-thirds of which pays for film and processing from AB Sea Photo. Of course, to participate you must be on the September trip, so sign up early and get a good bunk space....you'll need it to store all those Pelican cases. When you sign up, be sure to let Kathi McNally know that you want to participate in the competition, so we'll know how much film to buy. 

AUGUST BEACH DIVE

Our beach dive for August is set for "Shaw's Cove" in Laguna Beach on the 28th. The Cove is well protected from surges and wave action, which helps keep the surf low and the visibility good for the coastal beaches. Those who wish to sharpen their entry and exit skills can choose from either the rocky reef, sandy beach or shore rocks to impress all with their poise and skill.

High tide on this day will be at 8:41 AM. This will will allow good visibility and a chance to visit "Shaw's Borrow," a small tunnel in the reef that is too shallow to swim through when the tide is low. The less aggressive crowd can walk or lay on the soft sandy beach. There are easily accessile tide pools to the left and a reef with cracks and tide pool areas on the right. Water to the east has shallow reefs extending out about 100 yards which are covered with blade kelp and eel grass. To the west is a large reef with the highlight of the area called "Monroe's Crevice."

To locate "Monroe's Crevice" swim seaward along the ledge of the rocks past "Shaw's Borrow." This main channel begins as a 15 foot cut into the reef and narrows to a tunnel filled with Garibaldi and other marine life. Eventually it branches off into smaller channels and tunnels, where you'll find octopus, nudibranchs, sponges and a variety of anemones. One branch ends with an oblong opening called "The Portal." Swimming through this window puts you half way along a large north/south chasm that joins the main channel or exits seaward through the reef, depending on which way you turn. If you decide not to explore the "crevice," you can continue past the opening and find a reef with gorgonians, anemones and Garibaldi.

To arrive at "Shaw's Cove" take the 405 Freeway south past Irvine to Hwy. 133 south, which dead ends onto PCH in Laguna. Turn right on PCH and watch for a dive shop on the left. At the dive shop turn left onto Fairview. The walkway to the beach is at the end of this street. Parking is on the surrounding side streets and can be hard to find. Come join us for a great time.

Wild Wave - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the mini-traffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive; go to the left on to Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only Sea Diver club members and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.
