FIJI & THE SOLOMON ISLANDS PRESENTATION Dave Nesheim

At the December meeting of The Sea Divers, Dave Nesheim will present slides from a trip last May to Fiji and the Solomon Islands. Dave spent two days on the Adi Kuila in Fiji diving in the Bega Lagoon and ten days on the Bilikiki in the Solomon Islands. In Fiji, Dave liked the coral heads and the lush canyons north of Kauviti at a place called Side Streets because of the beautiful multi-colored soft corals and vivid red and yellow gorgonias. In the Solomon Islands the diving was done in three different locations: the Russell Islands, Mary Island and in the New Georgia Islands. The dives at Mary Island, an uninhabited island between the Russell Islands and the New Georgia group were Dave's favorite ones. He spent a lot of bottom time here hanging out with giant schools of barracuda and jacks. Altogether he made 42 dives on this trip and shot 44 rolls of film; several dives at Mary he used two cameras on a dive. Someone told him the only way to get a few good pictures is to keep shooting the film!! So come and share a few of these slides with him.

LESSON LEARNED ... DON'T USE THIS RESUME FOR SCUBA PRO

Several years ago I got this great idea that would solve all of the problems associated with taking Abalone (except for finding them). I call it the "Pneumatic Abalone Iron".

Many of us have experienced the frustration of prying nature's undersea suction cups off rocks, sometimes in very difficult locations or angles. Besides hard work, this prying could damage the shell or the meat of the creature, meaning sure death, whether you were successful or not. If you happened to pry an Ab that was just shy of the legal limit, and cut the foot, it is fruitless to put them back, since they are hemophiliacs (They bleed to death without the ability to clot blood), and usually die anyway.

That's where the "Pneumatic Ab Iron" comes in. Being a near genius engineer, I thought that if the Ab could use hydrostatic suction to clamp down on the rock, all that I would have to do is reverse this and the Abs would virtually jump into my game bag. I spent many hours (maybe two) designing the device and had it made by a local prototype shop. It uses the air from the tank, through a manual valve, to squirt air out small holes in the end of the tool. A sketch of the hardware is shown below.


I was ready to test this device and was pretty excited about it. I figured that once proven, the Fish and Game would pass new laws that would require this device to be used for all divers taking Abalone (since it eliminates the chances of damaging the critters and would minimize waste) and I would be living in a mansion with the royalties. So the testing began.

My first tests were land based for my small following of "Pneumatic Ab Iron" enthusiasts. I hooked the unit up to the BC inflator hose and was able to demonstrate it's ability to lift heavy flat objects such as frisbees, garbage cans etc. My friends were amazed at the work (sort of). My final test was on the wily abalone on his own turf.

Upon jumping in the water with my novel device (I heard all of you laughing on deck) I proceeded to the testing grounds. Within a few minutes, I found my test creature. With the diligence of a scientist, I positioned my "Iron" next to the Ab and let the bubbles fly as I pushed it under his belly. After a few minutes of low visibility due to bubbles, I found that the AB was not only still on the rock, but had clamped down on my fancy hardware and would not let go. The pneumatic prototype was not built for strength and prying, so there I was attached by my BC hose to this ornery creature. I reluctantly dug out my old fashioned Ab pry bar and began rescuing my invention and myself.

I did finally win over the Ab and returned to the boat with my beavertail between my legs. I had failed.

It turned out to be quite a conversation piece, and I still pull it out every one in a while to laugh. I wonder if I could somehow hook it up to the high pressure port......


