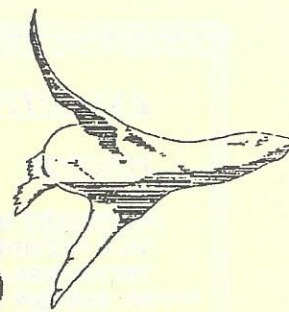




THE SEA DIVERS

CHARISMA will take us from 22nd Street to SHIP ROCK and other pinnacles and reefs on the front side of CATALINA. SHIP ROCK guards the approach to ISTHMUS COVE and aside from two shallow ledges astride the spine drops steeply to the sand close to 120 feet. Current can be a factor diving the pinnacle and is responsible for the typically high visibility in the area. The rock attracts a tremendous variety of sea life from the gorgonia fans and the deeper octorals to yellowtail and other predator fish to large angel sharks in the sand. One of the best dives around for VIDEO, PHOTOGRAPHY or just looking. BIRD ROCK just to the SSE of SHIP ROCK provides an opportunity to dive the north flat face which contains a vertical 60 foot wall and adjacent up to 90 foot deep kelp forests. Another excellent dive. These are both spectacular dives and as choice of depth can be planned into your dives, they can typically be dived by all skill levels. High current, etc., obviously increases the skill level requirements.

Following the SHIP ROCK/BIRD ROCK dive we will proceed to at least two or three other shallower pinnacles or other Isthmus reef structures and or the West End. Although not as abundant as on the other islands, SCALLOPS, FISH and ABALONE are available to the persistent gameperson. Pretty, too!!

The planned itinerary for this our first two-day of 1994 will take us out to San Miguel Island -- as always, weather permitting. Our first dive spot will be on the east side of the Santa Cruz Channel, hopefully on one of the abalone spots. We will then cruise over to the west (Santa Rosa) side and pick a good scallop and/or abalone area and then loop around either the north or south side of Santa Rosa picking off one dive either on the northwest tip (fish and scallops) or the southwest tip (fish and abalone).

We then hope to cross the San Miguel Passage onto the south side of San Miguel diving Crook Point and/or Wyckoff Ledge. We then plan to circle back around the east side of the island for one more dive before overnighing in Cuyler Harbor.

Weather permitting we would hope to tackle one of the major pinnacles (Wilson or Richardson); failing that, we will dive the lee side of Prince Island. We will then begin the run back to the mainland stopping for dives along the north side of either Santa Rosa or Santa Cruz.

This two-day will provide excellent opportunities for game (fish, abalone, scallops) and all kinds of photogenic sea life. Overall there will be dives for all skill levels -- although the pinnacles are strong intermediate to advanced dives in all but near perfect conditions.

Needless to say the PEACE is a great boat just be on -- diving or not!! Call Kathi (McNally) at (310) 30-1657 for early sign-up and bunk assignment as you pay in full!!

ONE OF YOUR MORE INTERESTING DAYS!!

WILD WAVE left the dock a little before 2:00 AM heading for Santa Barbara Island. The run over was comfortable, with just a little bump here and there, but the boat was not running hard -- not typical of the "Express."

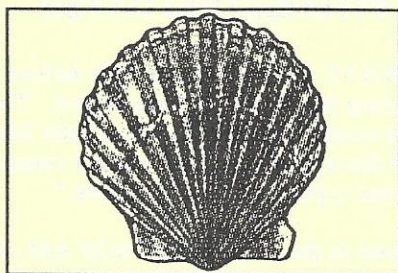
We arrived at the island about 6:20 AM, but by the time we anchored near the arch west of Webster Point it was almost 7:00 AM. This first spot was -- as always -- very nice diving. Depths to 80 feet or so, nice reef structures, including the arch, 40-50 foot visibility, light current. Bugs were deep in their condos!! During the dive the boat swung almost 180 degrees causing significant surprise and a resultant long swim for most.

We motored back east, with a now smoking, vibrating starboard engine as a result of a burnt piston -- not good!! We anchored on the not often dived 10 fathom spot. Again a real pretty dive in 50-60 feet of 50-60 foot visibility water. A noticeable current was running south to north. This spot yielded a few pink abs, a couple of nice fish and a difficult up-current swim (I hate that when it happens!) for several divers. We then motored back west to a spot just off Webster Point in about 50 feet of 25-35 foot visibility water. Nice canyons about 20-30 feet deep were the best bet until surge set in close to the island. Another pink ab or two and a few near misses on bugs.

The fourth dive was near the rookery on the east side. About six or eight divers hit the water before we aborted for poor visibility -- like zero to five!! The fifth spot was under the light (on Arch Point) in 45 feet of 10-15 foot visibility water. Again we took a smattering of abs in the somewhat surgy water.

Diving done for the day, we began our run back to San Pedro's Cabrillo Marina at about 1:20 PM. Mickey tried running both engines, but within 15 minutes he was forced to shut down the smokey starboard. We alternated between one and sort-of-two engines all the way back making for a slow run of 5 hours and 20 minutes -- which is a surprising 9 plus knots (about two-thirds normal speed -- not bad!). Just for fun we had a little scare when the port engine spewed out black smoke about 90 minutes out of Cabrillo -- but we made it. Yo, Mickey!!!

As a footnote, WILD WAVE is to receive two new engines, now that lobster season is over, which will take the boat out of service for about three weeks. As far as we know there is no impact to our schedule of dives.

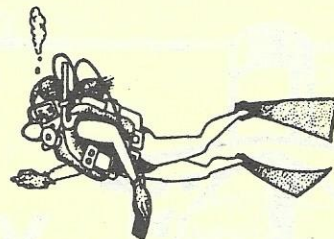

PRESIDENT'S AWARDS - 1993

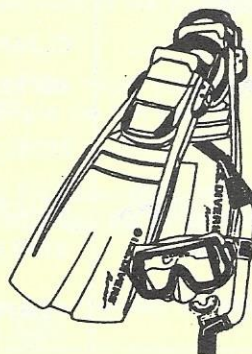
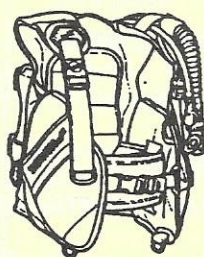


Once more it is the arduous, humorous and hazardous (and late this year) task of the club President to make the following awards for 1993:

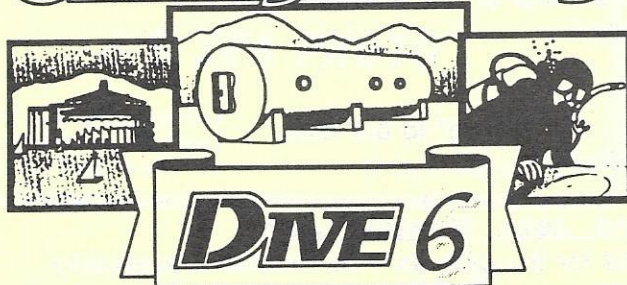

Wednesday, May 4, has been selected as the date for Chamber Day '94, the sixth annual fund raiser to benefit the hyperbaric chamber operating at the Isthmus on Catalina Island.

Hyperbaric chambers are the only means of treating embolism and bends, two life-threatening maladies that can affect divers. Because of the high amount of diving done in Southern California, the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber is very active. And even though Los Angeles County funds one-third of the chamber's costs, the fact is that two-thirds of the chamber's budget must come from other sources.

Chamber Day was conceived as a way for recreational divers to have fun diving and make a financial contribution to the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber at the same time. The dive-charter boats operating out of Southern California donate their time and services for the day, and divers pay to dive aboard one of the participating boats. The divers get a chance to dive Catalina for the day and also get a walking tour of the chamber facilities along with a commemorative "Chamber Day '94" t-shirt. A raffle prize drawing for major pieces of dive equipment will also be conducted. All the money raised from the event goes to support the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber.

Chamber Day '94 will cost \$59, which includes a day of diving and the commemorative t-shirt. To sign up for the event, call (310) 510-2338. Requests to be on a specific boat can be made at sign up. Payment for the event can be made by check.

Wild Wave - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the mini-traffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive; go to the left on to Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only Sea Diver club members and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.
