


Well folks here we are already into the 1993/94 lobster (aka: bug) season! Amazing how this year has just flipped on by.

The "Atlantis" will be our "Wild Wave" replacement for 1995 so we anticipate reacquainting the club with the boat and it's owner/skipper Jim Caslin and his crew on this trip. As a reminder the boat is 65' long 20' wide; sun deck; large bunks with privacy curtains; color TV/VCR and a full (all inclusive on this trip) galley. "Atlantis" is docked at the same Cabrillo Marina dock used by the "Wild Wave".

Our destination is San Nicolas island in pursuit of bugs (primarily); scallops; fish and diving for fun. Abalone are out of season as of 1 October 1994.

San Nicolas can still provide the big bugs, and for the dedicated and persistent the challenge of the bag limit of seven (!?#@?!!) is always there. Weather permitting we plan to do a couple of drift dives as we have in the past two years. We should make four or five dives throughout the day.
