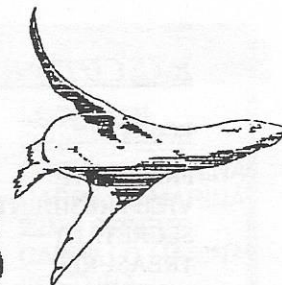

FROM THE EXECUTIVE YACHT...

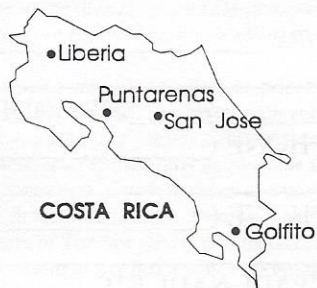

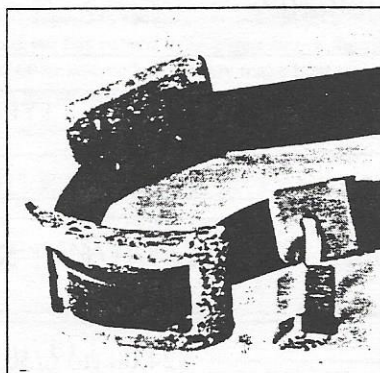

Our second two-day dive of 1995 is a great southern outer island cruise and dive to the very best spots. This Friday/Saturday affair has all the makings of a really outstanding trip!

Begg Rock is a group of pinnacles which rise about 15 feet above the water and then plunge in the most spectacular fashion to over 100 feet with rolling ledges from 30 feet to 60 feet. The rock is located about 7 miles north of San Nicolas Island, and is noted for its huge plate-sized scallops on the deeper ledges (easy to limit out at the one-day limit of 10). Photophiles and video buffs will be well served. Relative beginners should note that Begg Rock is fully exposed to the ocean, but on good days may be dived by all skill levels after appropriate pre-dive consultation with The Sea Divers' divemasters and a properly planned dive.

San Nicolas, the outer most of the southern islands, is noted for its relative remoteness and typically large size game. Ocean temperatures are up (60°F) like last year, making diving pleasant. Divers should also have no problem reaching the limit on abalone (pinks, greens, and/or reds). Large fish, such as Calico Bass, Sheephead, etc., can be found in the kelp beds and reefs. We will overnight at San Nicolas, probably in Dutch Harbor, with full dinner, socialize with good friends, and enjoy a typically great evening just relaxing. The following day we will either head to Begg Rock for our second attempt, or cruise to Santa Barbara Island, which is the smallest, prettiest island, and has a little of everything. The spectacular underwater arches, walls, reefs, sea lions, and other sea life are great for photography and video and visibility is usually exceptional. You should be able to complete your second day abalone limit at Santa Barbara -- mostly pinks and greens with a smattering of whites and reds. Again, large fish surround the area, including the occasional black sea bass (these are for viewing only!!!)

In our established two-day tradition, awards will be featured during this trip. Sign-up early to make sure you have a spot on this charter. Bunks will be preassigned on a FIRST PAID basis. Call Kathy (Kalohi) at (310) 719-1816 to sign-up. Boarding begins at 7:00 PM on Thursday, 20 July and everyone should be on board by 11:00 PM. Join us and relax --- CHECK OUR PRICES!!!! GREAT TRIP!!

A Swell Day of Diving!

Encore left the 22nd Street dock at a little after 1:00 AM for our 3 June 1995 dive at the northwest end of San Clemente Island. The initial part of the run was flat with little motion on the boat. However, once we passed the east end of Catalina, rock and roll set in. By the time we arrived over Nine Fathom Reef the swells were fairly knarly. Skipper Kenny H elected to wait and see as the swells were supposed to lay down as the day went by and opted for the first dive near the east tip of Northwest Harbor. The top of the reef is at about 50 feet with a nice wall dropping to 80 to 100 feet. Visibility was excellent at 50 to 60 feet and there was a slight current along the wall. Temperature was a balmy 56°F.

Our second dive was just east of the north limit of Northwest Harbor poking out a little more into the swells. Comfort level on the boat was not good!! Dive conditions were similar to the first dive with rocks and mini-canyons to explore. Dive three was just east of Castle Rock near the boilers. Diving was comfortable with some effect of the swells at depth except when up against the reef wall, replete with purple coral, which protected one from swell effects. Depth was to 40 feet and visibility 40-50 feet and 57°F water temperature.

By this time most of us were ready for a less "swelly" spot. We bow anchored and stern tied to a large rock on the beach just north of Wilson Cove which is in the Navy restricted area. They left us alone which has apparently been the norm lately. There was the possibility of either halibut or abalone. Didn't see any halibut but there was a smattering of abalone in shallow. Depths were from 0-40 feet and 20-30 feet visibility. Temperature was 58°F. There was sufficient time for either one long dive or two shorter dives. Most made one long dive.

We left the island about 1:15 PM arriving back at the dock just after 6:00 PM. The ocean did lay down some and the sun was quite bright and warm for most of the day. It was a nice day of diving although the swell did keep us off a couple planned dive spots. There was no real booby prize candidates although Sharon H. lost her weight belt off the step, she was excused as the step was real sporty in the swells and one could have lost almost anything including (for the guys only!) one's manhood!

Diving Memories. Just 14 Years Ago....

Reported below is the club's announcement (mistakes and all) on our graduating club members from the LACC Advanced Diver Program (1981). Although a very tough program which lasted about 4 months with Friday evening class and Saturday and Sunday diving, it was a very worthwhile course. It turned me from an unsure wimp diver into a quite mature and confident diver in those 4 months. However, many times during the course, I questioned my sanity for doing all this to myself. Some of the less fond memories include:

- Compass navigating in zero visibility while buddy breathing.
- Surf entry and exits at night through 6 to 8 foot breakers off the rocks at the bottom of Cardiac Hill.
- A half mile hike carrying dive gear to the beach east of La Jolla Canyon, a half mile (plus) swim, a 110 foot simulated decompression dive, the half mile (plus) swim back to the beach and the half mile trek back to the upper parking lot.
- Surf entry and exits at Leo Carillo beach where the 10 foot breakers break in the last 10 feet - known as "champs in/chumps out".
- Night diving at Laguna without face masks.
- Emergency out of air ascents from 90 feet in Redondo Canyon.
- Learning all the latin names for sea life.
- Breath hold anything (i.e. skin diving) especially in thick kelp.
- Equipment dump and retrieve - all of it.

Despite all that, we enjoyed and don't regret. Our TRW Sea Divers team finished the course as the top team and I was fortunate enough to be named "Outstanding Graduate" - yes, really!!

A Real Deep Dive - 830 Feet!

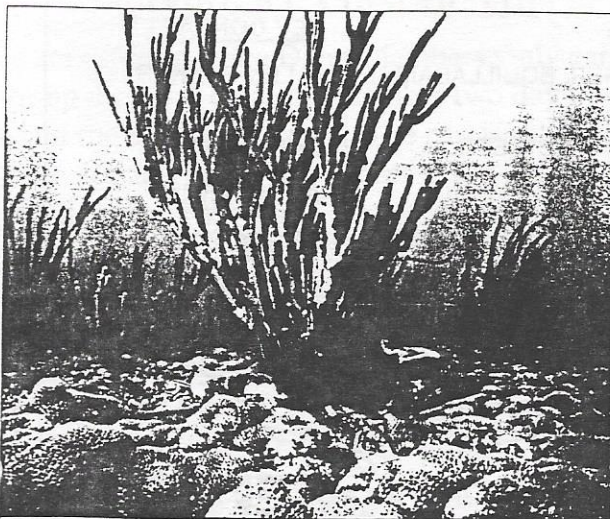
During a recent visit to Grand Cayman Island, via the brand new cruise ship *Legend of the Seas*, I made a dive to 830 feet and the wreck of the *Kirk Pride*. The wreck is a intercoastal freighter which sank in 1976, slid and rolled down the famous west wall until it jammed essentially upright between the wall and a major pinnacle. The dive, obviously, was not on SCUBA(!) but in a small research submarine, two of which are stationed at Georgetown, Grand Cayman.

The subs are 20 feet long, 5.5 ton observation/one atmosphere craft which can accommodate two persons (at \$295 apiece!) and the pilot. The two observers sit on a sort of "bench" looking through a 36 inch diameter hemispherical front viewport. Entry into the sub is from the shore tender, across a 15 foot inflatable and down the 3 foot diameter hatch onto the "bench". Once inside, the pilot gave a quick emergency briefing and we cast off from the inflatable and began the dive.

Orientation to the wall was difficult due to the visual effect of the hemispherical port. What I initially thought was "close" was actually over 100 feet away. Once oriented, the brain "synced-up" and the visual effects cleared. Amazingly, the brightness increased as we went deeper without lights. At about 600 feet, the pilot suggested we look down and slightly to the right. There was the wreck about ½ inch long!!! Visibility had to be over 300 feet. As we approached the *Kirk Pride* it slowly grew until the stern completely filled the port. Now for the lights.

We moved down and along the starboard side, then up over the wedging pinnacle and over the bow. Amazing sights, including the bridge telegraph at STOP and the anchor chain cutting thorough the deck steel. We slowly began to rise - lights now on. There were stalked crinoids to 3 feet tall, madrepora fans up to several feet across and in various colors with assessed ages up to 200 years. As we rose higher, huge tube sponges, black coral and flat elephant ear fans appeared. Also seen were slit shells valued at over \$1000. Unreal!! Higher were red and purple barrel sponges and deep sea gargonians and then we rose over the edge of the wall and broke the surface.

The whole dive surface to surface was just under one hour and I had no problem whatever with the cost-plus-tip for the experience. The pilot was very informative and although not armchair luxury the "bench" was adequate for divers or others that would appreciate the dive. I was one of eight passengers on the cruise ship to make the dive so I consider myself rather fortunate to have had the opportunity. The Grand Cayman wall drops to 6000 feet - now there's a thought!! Want to sign-up??

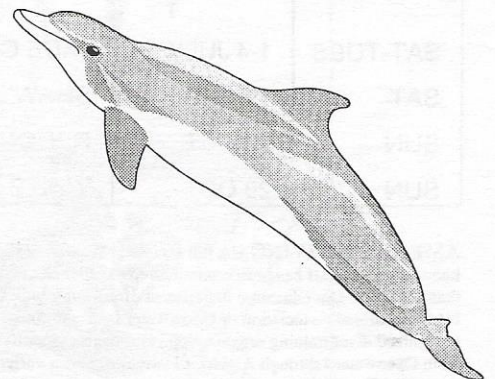

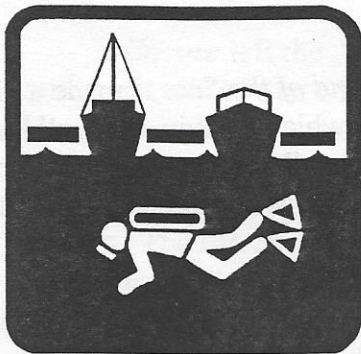

October 22, 1995

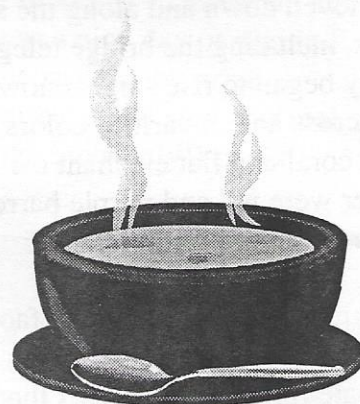

Another Great Bouillabaisse Extraordinaire!

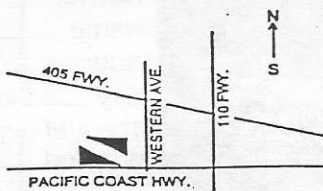

Atlantis - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the mini-traffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks.
