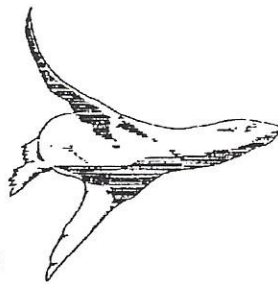

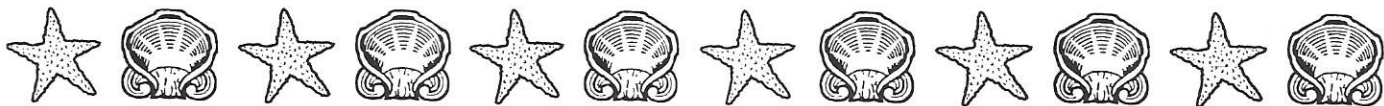
FROM THE EXECUTIVE CALENDER...

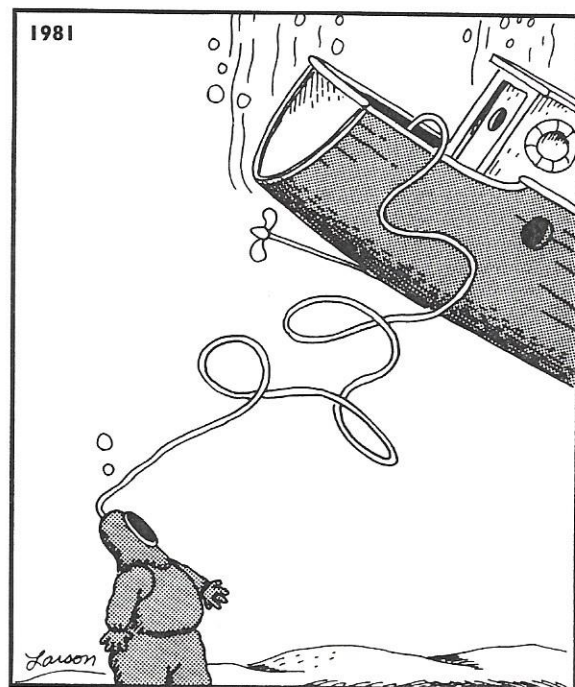

We will leave Cabrillo Marina at 11:00 p.m. Friday for a run at Begg Rock, anticipating arrival at about 6:30 a.m. Depending on ocean conditions, a Begg Rock dive is suitable for all except beginners -- if the ocean is "up," Begg Rock is only for advanced divers. Later dives around San Nicolas should be suitable for all skill levels.

Begg Rock is situated about 7 miles NNW of San Nicolas Island and is a small (in number) group of pinnacles that rise in spectacular fashion from over 100 feet, with rolling ledges and drop offs, to break the surface by 10 to 15 feet. Most of the rock is totally covered with anemones and other pinnacle sea life including huge plate-size scallops. Most of the large scallops have been removed from the upper reaches of Begg Rock but they can still be found in quantity below 80 feet. Large fish abound and the video/photo buffs cannot find a better spot. Following our pinnacle dive we will move to San Nicolas Island.

San Nicolas, the outer most of the southern islands, is the least accessible island and thus retains a fair amount of large size game. Active divers should have no problem reaching the limit of two abalone (mostly reds). Large fish, of many varieties make for happy speargunners. Although not the best, photo/video-ites should find plenty to "shoot" in the environs of San Nicolas.

All in all this promises to be a great single day with Joel I. and the *Atlantis* - especially with our all inclusive fare for air, food, snacks and beverages. Multi-Faceted July Two-Day

Now this trip had a little of everything. Read on!! *Charisma* began to bump around just after passing Santa Barbara Island in the wee-hours of Friday morning. By the time San Nicolas Island was in sight, rock and roll had set in seriously. The wind was up early and we were obviously in for a windy yet sunny day. The south or back side of San Nicolas provided some shelter from the North Westerlies, but even there it was flapping the kelp and the surface pretty good. In addition, current was a major factor on the first two dives.

Dive one was about one mile east of the Bravo Area marker on a nice reef with 40 feet visibility. Water temperature was between 56° and 57°F and to 60 feet deep. Some scallops were available, for the determined. Return to the "mother ship" was no fun at all. Most divers came up ahead of the boat which turned out to be the wrong place as the current had swung around some. All but a few were helped in on a dual set of current lines. Dive two was right at the Bravo marker. Conditions were similar except depth was to about 45 feet with more areas of sand. Once more current was a significant factor. This time however, over half made the step without current line assistance.

Having done current twice, John H. anchored *Charisma* tucked in at Dutch Harbor. Much, much more pleasant with no current and a calmer surface. Also this was a good red abalone area and a significant number of us got our two for the day!! Depths were to 60 feet or greater if individual dive profiles allowed. We made two dives at this spot. We made one more move for the fifth dive between the spots for dives one and two. Current was no longer a factor. Despite it all we had a good solid day of diving, and we elected to overnight at San Nic in lieu of a run in heavy seas to Santa Barbara. Right choice!!

John H. fired up *Charisma's* V-12s at about 4:00 a.m. and arrived at Santa Barbara, after a comfortable run, at 6:40 a.m. The first spot northwest of Webster Point turned out to be too high of a current - here we go again - so we moved to the northwest tip of Sutil Island. Nice spot, with visibility to 50 feet and a few scallops for those so inclined. Depth under the boat was 100 feet which rose fairly quickly to 60 feet and less as one approached the island. Temperature was a pleasant 61°F. John H. then moved *Charisma* close in to the east side of Santa Barbara looking for the day's take of abalone. As we were setting the anchor facing the swells, a relatively large swell kicked the bow way up and the stern way down. The resultant thud from below did not sound good and a second less severe thud added to the concern. We moved!! As other divers headed off to abalone land, I volunteered to check things out. Definitely not good! The port prop had two of four blades seriously bent, and the starboard prop was scarred but not bent. The port rudder also looked a little askew. Moving to spot three told us the worst. The port side vibrated badly. The starboard side just slightly. Further examination showed the port rudder was O.K. but several bolt heads were missing on both drive shaft V-supports. Dive three was just east of Webster Point. Pretty spot with a smattering of abalone. Visibility was 30-40 feet, no current (!) depths to 50 feet and calm on the surface.

We elected to ride *Charisma* home rather than switch to *Encore* which was also at Santa Barbara. We left earlier than planned - our choice- and made about 7 knots on the slightly vibrating starboard engine and drive. We docked at about 6:40 p.m. *Charisma* was to be dry docked Monday for repairs and a planned bottom painting. Could have been worse, at least we made it back under own power. No contest here, the booby prize went to John H.!!! The *Charisma* crew was excellent and in particular the "chef" worked hard to keep us very well fed. As I said, a multi-faceted trip.

AUGUST BEACH DIVE - SHAW'S COVE 12 AUGUST 1995

Our beach dive for August is set for "Shaw's Cove" in Laguna Beach on the 12th. The cove is well protected from surge and wave action, which helps keep the surf low and the visibility good for the coastal beaches. Those who wish to sharpen their entry and exit skills, can choose from either the rocky reef, sandy beach, or shore rocks to impress all with their poise and skill.

Hide tide typically allows good visibility and a chance to visit "Shaw's Burrow", a small tunnel in the reef that is too shallow to swim through when the tide is low. The less aggressive crowd can walk or lay on the soft sandy beach. There are easily accessible tide pool areas on the right. Water to the east has shallow reefs extending out about 100 yards that are covered with blade kelp and eel grass. To the west is a large reef with the highlight of the area called "Monroe's Crevice". To locate "Monroe's Crevice", swim seaward along the edge of the rocks past "Shaw's Burrow". This main channel begins as a 15 foot cut into the reef and narrows to a tunnel filled with Garibaldi and other marine life. Eventually it branches off into smaller channels and tunnels, where you'll find octopus, nudibranchs, sponges, and a variety of anemones. One branch ends with an oblong opening called "The Portal". Swimming through this window puts you halfway along a large north/south chasm that joins the main channel or exits seaward through the reef, depending on which way you turn. If you decide not to explore the "Crevice", you can continue past the opening and find a reef with gorgonians, anemones, and garibaldi.

To arrive at "Shaw's Cove" take the 405 freeway south past Irvine to Hwy 133 South, this will dead end into PCH in Laguna. Turn right on PCH and watch for a dive shop on the left, at the dive shop turn left onto Fairview. The walkway to the beach is at the end of this street, parking is on surrounding side streets and can be hard to find. Come join us for a great time.

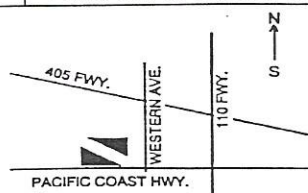

Atlantis - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the mini-traffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks.
