- 5) Accept the responsibility of your own safety on every dive.


Nothing new here but they are important basics. Dive safe, have fun, and dive regularly.

The November trip will be the last 1995 Atlantis trip and the last Sunday trip of 1995. The infamous (or is it notorious) Joel I. and the ship shape Atlantis will be heading to Santa Barbara Island.

Aside from lobster, Santa Barbara offers just about every element for diving. The tremendous variation of reefs, walls, arches and canyons provide superior opportunities for photography and video. Add to that the extensive variety of sea life and typically great visibility and you've already got the best of diving. Some of the larger fish inhabit the environs, so you spear hungry types will not be disappointed if the lobster don't bite!

This trip is suitable for all levels of experience and we should make 4 to 5 dives. Beginners and the less experienced intermediate divers hould be aware that ocean conditions can be difficult the the event of high currents or surface wave action. Call Kathy Kaholi at (310) 719-1816 for sign-up. Bunks will be pre-assigned on a first come, first paid basis. So sign up now. The Fun and the bugs are waiting for you at Santa Barbara Island. Boarding begins at 8:00 PM on the 11th for a 1:00 AM departure on the 12th. Don't forget your chem ghts and dive lights as an early a.m. night dive is possible.

An Almost Begg Rock

Atlantis left the Cabrillo Marina dock about 11:20 p.m. headed with a full load of Sea Divers to the elusive Begg Rock. Somewhere in the early a.m. Saturday, Joel I. turned south and headed to the east end of San Nicolas and the protected south side of the island. Weather at Begg was beyond marginal due to wind. Surprisingly, it was flat calm with no wind at our first spot about one mile west of the east end. Depths were to 60 feet in 59°F water with no current. Abalone were available along with a smattering of medium sized scallops and a few large fish. By the end of the first dive the wind was ruffling the surface and as we headed further west the wind increased noticeably. Our second dive was at about the midpoint of the south side. Surface chop was up the wind was up but so was the kelp, so no current. Depths to 50 feet or so, visibility at 25 to 30 feet and temperature down a degree or two. Again abalone and scallops were the order.

It was now even windier and we doubled back east into the west end of Dutch Harbor. Lousy spot!! There was a significant amount of ocean plant debris flowing back and forth with the swells, making the weaker stomach divers return to the boat fairly quickly. Depth was to 45 feet with just a hint of current. Visibility was about 20 feet out of the debris on the bottom! A short move east put us in better water with less muck around. Otherwise conditions were much the same as dive three. A smattering of scallops, abalone, and fish were brought on board.


Diving over, wind up, we turned for home. Joel I. has *Atlantis* in fine tune making the dock at 6 hours 38 minutes from the island. Not bad at all!! We did not award our typical boobie prize as there was no really outstanding boobies. Roger S. got <u>real</u> close with his tank falling out of the backpack routine at the gate. Dexter K. was next in line with his no fins performance and as usual John D. gets a honorable mention for being attached to the boat after donning his gear for dive three. Amazing but not quite award material!! The *Atlantis* crew did a nice job, the food was good and even with a full 30 diver load it was not too crowded on the back deck. See you in October.



Dear Krabby

Dear Krabby,

I hear it from the instructors and I read about it in all of the dive magazines but I just don't get it. What exactly is neutral buoyancy? Daniel Webster says 'buoyancy' is "the ability or tendency to float or rise in liquid or in air...the power to keep something afloat, etc." Then if I look up neutral it says "indifferent". It seems to me that things can either be buoyant or they're not. They either float or sink. Is being neutrally buoyant analogous with being 'almost pregnant'? I would appreciate it if you would explain this whole concept to me.

Full of Air

Dear Gas Bag,

The main thing you need to understand is that diving is a sport that has evolved to extreme levels of commercialism. The point being that manufacturers and retailers will take any simple thing and make it sound more complicated solely for the purpose of being able to charge more for it.

One of the first things you learn from your instructors is how to properly weight yourself to account for all of the gear you wear when diving. But, the instructors use a rule of thumb when estimating the weight for the individuals and don't necessarily take into account the differences in physiology of the students. Also, instructors like to add a little extra weight so they don't have to go looking at the surface for their students when they want them all to be on the bottom of the ocean for a dive.


Now let's take the subject of 'buoyancy'. You're right in that it means 'to float' but the dive gear people take this one step further and insistently advise you that to be properly equipped for diving you need a 'buoyancy compensator'. This piece of gear is essentially a balloon in the shape of a vest with a surface on the back to attach a tank via straps. The logical question is, how can a balloon compensate for buoyancy? The fact is, it can't.

It can only compensate for the *lack* of buoyancy.

Here's where they've got you. You're a student and you sink like a rock because your instructor told you to wear too much weight. Only you're too ignorant to know it's too much weight and anyway your instructor is a god. They know everything. So you hear about these things that can prevent you from sinking and you think 'Hey, I've gotta have one of those!" So you wander into your local dive store, plop down several hundred dollars, and become the proud owner of a really expensive balloon. But, at least it comes in nifty colors.

Back to your topic of 'neutral buoyancy'. It has a basis in commercialism too. The neutral, or indifferent portion refers to the point of time where you've acquired enough knowledge and skills in the diving arena such that you are essentially immune to the high pressure sales techniques employed at the dive stores. The buoyancy part comes in when though this realization of your 'neutrality' you come to the conclusion that you won't have to blindly spend money on gear you don't want or need and hence raise your spirits because you know your bank account won't get drained so rapidly in the future.

Sea Diver Quote History


We began "Quotes of the Month" in the May 1988 newsletter in which there were just three quotes:

Atlantis - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the minitraffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks
