


# THIE SEA DIVERS



#### CATALINA PINNACLES

**CHARISMA**

The mighty *Charisma* will take us from 22nd Street to several of the pinnacles on the front side of Catalina. Ship Rock guards the approach to Isthmus Cove and aside from two shallow ledges astride the spine drops steeply to the sand close to 120 feet. Current can be a factor diving the pinnacle and is responsible for the typically high visibility in the area. The rock attracts a tremendous variety of sea life from the gargonia fans and the deeper octorals to yellowtail and the predator fish to large angel sharks in the sand. One of the best dives around for video, photography, or just looking.

Following the Ship Rock dive, we will move to one or two of the pinnacles toward the West End. Eagle Rock, Indian Rock, and the adjacent three pinnacles are likely candidates. For our last dive we will return to the Isthmus area to Bird Rock just to the SSE of Ship Rock. This will provide an opportunity to dive the north flat face which contains a vertical 60 foot wall and adjacent up to 90 foot deep kelp forests - another excellent dive. These are all spectacular dives and as choice of depth can be planned into your dives, they can typically be dived by all skill levels. High current, a feature last year, obviously increased the skill level requirements. Although not as abundant as on the other islands, scallops and fish are available for the persistent gamesperson.

As on most Sea Diver's charters, the trip includes air, food, snacks, and beverages. Call Kathy Kalohi at (310) 719-1816 for sign-up. Come along - check out our all inclusive price against anyone!!

The planned itinerary for this our first two-day of 1996 will take us out to San Miguel Island -- as always, weather permitting. Our first dive spot will be on the east side of Santa Rosa Island in a good scallop and/or red abalone area.. We will loop around either the north or south side of Santa Rosa depending on ocean conditions picking off one dives either on the northwest tip (fish and scallops) or the southwest tip (fish and abalone).

We then plan to cross the San Miguel Passage onto the south side of San Miguel diving Crook Point, Wychoff Ledge, and Tyler Bight. We will then circle back around the east side of the island for one or more dives before overnighting in Cuyler Harbor.

Weather permitting we would hope to tackle Wilson Rock or, failing that, we will probably dive the lee side of Prince Island. Then we'll begin the run back to the mainland stopping for dives along the north side of Santa Rosa, possibley at Talcott Shoal.

This two-day will provide excellent opportunities for game (fish, red abalone, scallops) and all kinds of photogenic sea life. Overall there will be dives for all skill levels -- although, Wilson Rock and other pinnacles are considered to be for strong intermediate to advanced dives in all but near perfect conditions.

The *Peace* is a great boat just to be on -- diving or not!! Call Kathy (Kalohi) at (310) 719-1816 for early sign-up and bunk assignment as you pay in full\*!! We have a minimum of half the boat and this will fill early. Other spots may be available depending on the other half boat sign-ups. DON'T WAIT!! Don't forget the hot tub -- nice!!

\*Member price is \$160 if you pay <u>IN FULL</u> by 12 August 1996.

#### March Madness?

Our March trip was planned for the *Atlantis* to San Nicolas Island. We anticipated a light load of maybe 20-22 divers about a week before the charter. When everything shook out, we had 15 paid divers and two diversasters. After some serious negotiations we made it a Santa Barbara destination for essentially the money in hand. 'Nuff said!


The day was beautiful with warm sun most of the morning, haze for awhile in the early PM but reasonably warm, then hot sun for most of the run back to Cabrillo. Early tanning season!

Atlantis is now running at 11 knots, thanks to Joel I.'s energies, making Santa Barbara in about 4 hours. The first dive was immediately east of Arch Point in about 95 feet of 60 foot visibility water. There was a slight current and the temperature was a surprising 55°F. Nice dive in an area where literally millions of Brittle Stars live. The odd bug was around but no takers. Joel I. then moved to the 80 foot spot northwest of Webster Point. Roger S. was the first one in and barely caught the step as the high current ran him along the boat. Abandoned this one!! We settled for the Arch - underwater one! This is always a nice dive. There was some surge but otherwise a comfortable dive, up to 60 feet, approaching the arch, 70 feet visibility and a balmy 56°F. All the scallops are gone. We then moved to Webster Point which provided slightly different topography in 50 feet of water, some surge and lower visibility at about 40 feet. Temperature was up to 58°F. Our fourth and final dive was off the southeast tip of the island. Not a great spot with armies and armies of sea urchins in the canyons below ridges with kelp and other growth. A little weird!! Depths to 40 feet, no current, 30-40 feet visibility and a real balmy 63°F.

There were two or three bugs on board, a few good sized fish and a group of happy divers as the diving in general was comfortable, the reefs interesting, and the day just plain nice. The ocean was calm all day. Santa Barbara was not per plan but the day out was, so what the hell. Hope to see more of us in April!

This little gem is another lesson that could have been disastrous. It IS true, it IS recent, it IS a club member on a non-club dive. It was not me!!!


- Bug hunting at 50 feet.


#### TANK PAINTING SPECIAL!!



#### Atlantis - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the minitraffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

#### Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

#### Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

#### DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks
