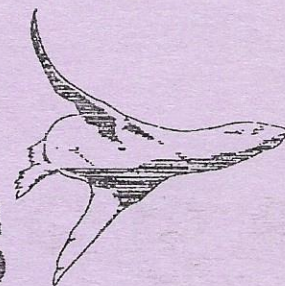

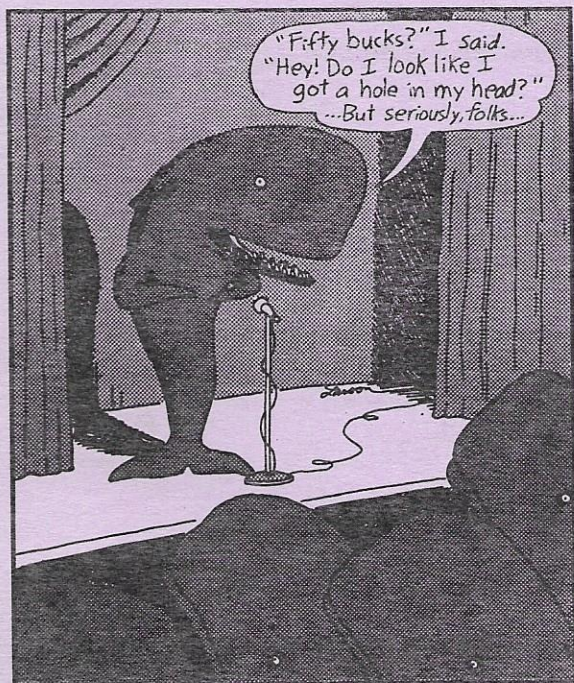

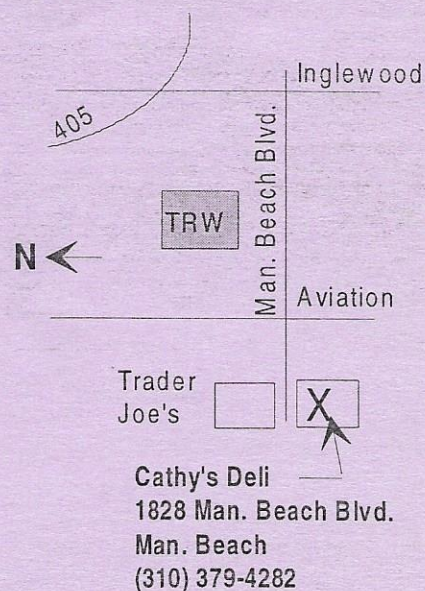
### CLUB HISTORY

## CHARISMA TO-BEGG AND NIC

26/27 JULY 1996 (Fri/Sat)

BEGG ROCK / SAN NICOLAS

Our second two-day dive of 1996 is a great southern outer island cruise and dive to the very best spots. This Friday/Saturday affair has been the making of really outstanding trips in past years.

Begg Rock is a group of pinnacles which rise about 15 feet above the water and then plunge in the most spectacular fashion to over 100 feet with rolling ledges from 30 feet to 60 feet. The rock is located about 7 miles north of San Nicolas Island, and is noted for its huge plate-sized scallops on the deeper ledges (easy to limit out at the one-day limit of 10). Photophiles and video buffs will be well served. Relative beginners should note that Begg Rock is fully exposed to the ocean, but on good days may be dived by all skill levels after appropriate pre-dive consultation with The Sea Divers' divemasters and a properly planned dive.

San Nicolas, the outer most of the southern four islands, is noted for its relative remoteness and typically large size game. Ocean temperatures are up around 60°F, making diving pleasant. Divers should also have no problem reaching the limit on red abalone. Large fish, such as Calico Bass, Sheephead, etc., can be found in the kelp beds and reefs. We will overnight at San Nicolas, probably in Dutch Harbor, with full dinner, socialize with good friends, and enjoy a typically great evening just relaxing. The following day we will either head to Begg Rock for our second attempt, dive around San Nicolas again, or cruise to Santa Barbara Island, which is the smallest prettiest island and has a little of everything. The spectacular underwater arches, walls, reefs, sea lions, and other sea life are great for photography and video and visibility is usually exceptional. Again large fish surround the area, including the occasional black sea bass (these are for viewing only!!!).

In our established two-day tradition, awards will be featured during this trip. Sign-up early to make sure you have a spot on this charter. Bunks will be preassigned on a FIRST PAID basis. Call Kathy (Kalohe) at (310) 719-1816 to sign-up. Boarding begins at 7:00 PM on Thursday, 26 July and everyone should be on board by 11:00 PM. Join us and relax --- CHECK OUR PRICES!!!! GREAT TRIP!!

## Surprises at Santa Barbara

*Encore* arrived at the underwater arch west of Santa Barbara Island about 7:00 AM with a near full load of Sea Divers and a few non-members. Once anchored, we realized that the arch was down a fairly strong current and the boat had settled across the 4 to 6 foot swells. Not the best position nor the most comfortable motion. Diving echoed the conditions with noticeable surge to over 50 feet, relatively poor visibility, for Santa Barbara, at 25 feet or so and the fairly strong current. Typical depths were to 60 or 70 feet and beyond if one pursued depth!! The water was a comfortable 60°F or so. The boat motion sucked!!

For the second dive we tucked in close on the north Side of the old Abalone City area (not anymore!). The water was greenish but calm and no current. Depths were shallow to 45 feet, visibility a surprising 15 feet - looked worse - and water temperatures to about 63°F. This spot yielded the only significant game of the day, a nice halibut knifed by Pete K. - no spear gun!! The third spot was tucked in just east of Sutil Island on a series of nice reefs with 30 feet of visibility. Water was up to 64°F - nice. The only significant observation on our dive was a large ray making a clumsy landing in a sand patch that looked like an airplane wreck!

By now sun and the veranda was setting in for some so the fourth dive again tucked in close on the south side was "undersubscribed". Conditions were much the same as dive three. Dave G. made a long long surface swim in search of yellowtails that we had spotted during the move. Not to be!! We motored quite a way to pick Dave up, then began to run back under a very hot sun, with very little breeze. We had seen very few abs, very few bugs, very few scallops, and very few fish - the visibility was poor, not good for photography or just looking. Somewhat surprising for Santa Barbara. Nevertheless, it beat working and the weather was just spectacular. The run back was calm and uneventful, we arrived at the dock just about 6:00 PM. Two dive boat related items: Joel I. is no longer the skipper on *Atlantis* and surprisingly, and unfortunately for us, the *Charisma* may be sold!!

## LA PAZ AND PUNTA PESCADERO

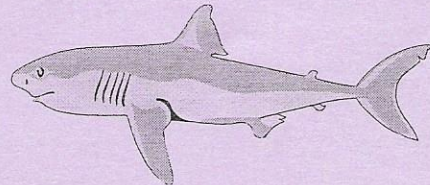
The club is planning the now almost annual trip to Baja Mexico 24 through 30 September 1996. This year we plan to spend three nights at La Concha in La Paz and three nights at the Hotel Punta Pescadero which is exactly halfway between La Paz and Cabo San Lucas. We plan two days of diving from La Paz and two days of diving from Punta Pescadero. Total cost of the trip for divers is about \$850 and about \$550 for non-divers. This includes round-trip air fare, hotels, transfers (including round trip from La Paz to Punta Pescadero), and four days of two tank diving (extra tank can be added for \$10 each). ### The Club and Beach Diving

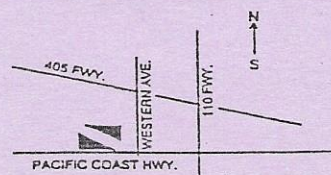

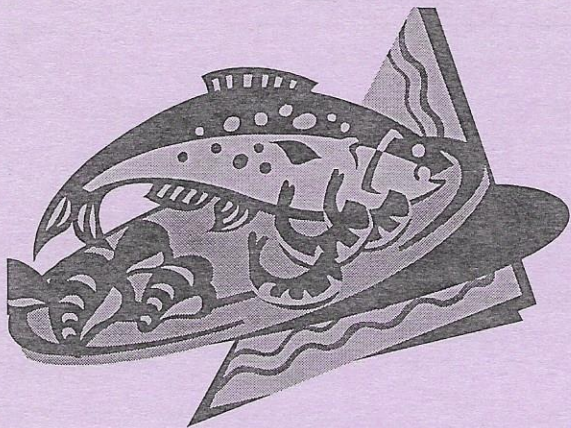

## **BOUILLABAISSE EXTRAORDINAIRE**

**30 JUNE - VETERAN'S PARK, REDONDO BEACH**

### **DIVING - REFRESHER COURSE -**

### **BOUILLABAISSE COOKOUT/POTLUCK**

We will dive just south of the pier at Redondo adjacent to Veteran's Park. For those unfamiliar with the dive site, it offers an easy sandy beach entry. The surf is typically small due to the Redondo Canyon at this location. Following a sloping sand bottom, the diver encounters the old Redondo pier pilings about 50 feet out. They stand above the sand bottom reaching 10 feet and more towards the surface. Their long submersion leaves them covered with red corinactus and hollowed out havens for crabs. Continuing further, the pilings end in about 80 feet of water over the edge of Redondo Canyon. Anyone requiring a short "refresher" in diving should contact John Mowrey for appropriate arrangements. Park in the Redondo Beach Municipal parking lot on the south side of Veteran's Park at 25 cents a half-hour (so bring lots of quarters!!!).

Grande Master Chef Parker aided by Petite Fleur Dacey, will be stirring up a warm and filling pot of bouillabaisse that is guaranteed to satisfy the most discriminating diver. "Le Chef" asks all who plan to partake of this tasty concoction to **BRING SEAFOOD, CAUGHT OR BOUGHT, TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE POT.** We typically add some or all of the following seafood to the base. All seafood should be **UNCOOKED!**

- Scallops - small, medium or large, some preferred in the shell
- Clams - typically small, medium or large in the shell
- Lobster - Any! In or out of shell
- Fish - all varieties, cleaned and deboned
- Mussels - in the shell
- Shrimp - medium or large, usually in the shell
- Oysters - small or medium, out of the shell
- Crab - medium to large legs, claws in the shell
- Abalone - Any! Most will be used for appetizers.
- "Calamari" - tentacles (rings) or "little guys"
- Other - we'll try almost anything!

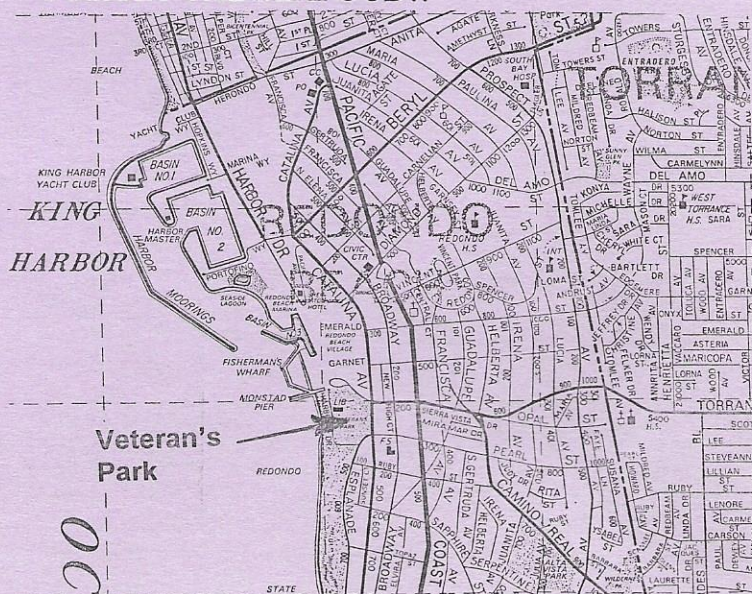
Crusty bread will be provided but bring your own beverages, other accompaniments, and a potluck if you are not into bouillabaisse!

### Atlantis - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the mini-traffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

### Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

### Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

## DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks.

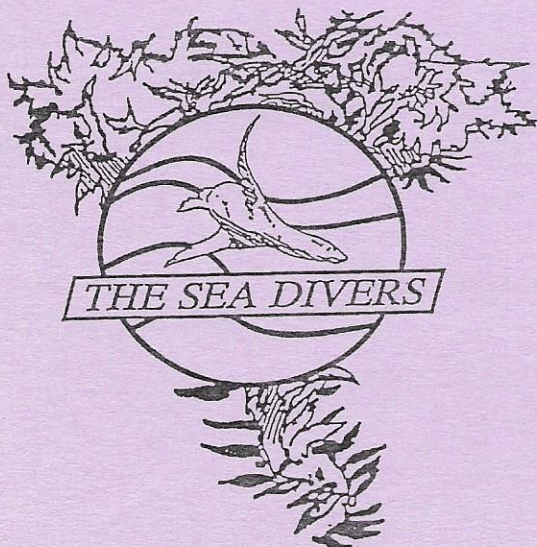
