Atlantis - Cabrillo Marina

South on Harbor freeway, left on Caffey, left on 22nd Street, right on Via Cabrillo Marina and follow all the way to the end, turning off the minitraffic circle onto Whaler's Walk and go to far end of parking lot. Boat is at the end of the walkway at Berth 31.

Charisma/Encore - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks


JUST FOURTEEN YEARS AGO...







LA PAZ AND PUNTA PESCADERO UPDATE

The club has planned the now almost annual trip to Baja Mexico 24 through 30 September 1996. This year we will spend three nights at La Concha in La Paz and three nights at the Hotel Punta Pescadero which is exactly halfway between La Paz and Cabo San Lucas. We will have two days of diving from La Paz and an open itinerary (i.e. diving, fishing, snorkeling, or just kick back) in Punta Pescadero. Total cost of the trip for divers is about \$730 and about \$543 for non-divers. This includes round-trip air fare, hotels, transfers (including round trip from La Paz to Punta Pescadero), and two day of two tank diving (extra tank can be added for \$10 each) at La Paz. 

ABO SAN LUCAS—It is an obscure record and certainly an unofficial one, but it is a record a local skipper is likely to hold for a long time and one he probably will never live down.

After all, not many others will be able to say they hooked and landed a *gringo*.

The Mexican skipper, as the story goes, had put his trolling lures out where he shouldn't have: beyond the famous rock arches signifying Land's End, an area popular among divers and snorkelers.

The hookup was almost immediate. The fisherman, a passenger on the boat, innocently went into battle, pumping and reeling, thinking he had a large grouper at the end of his line.


Half an hour later, however, he reeled to the surface a bubble-blowing, very irate scuba diver who had been hooked in the wetsuit in a part of his back he couldn't reach.

The diver, like many game fish these days, was carefully released and left to simmer in the cool, clear water from which he was pulled.

The skipper left for deeper water, a little embarrassed and well aware that this dubious catch would become his claim to fame, like it or not.

"It was the biggest diver ever caught in Cabo," says a smiling Guillermo "Memo" Gamio, 45, manager of a small independent fleet. "A world-record . . . like a 250-pound diver."
