Typically our February charter has been on Charisma to San Clemente. This year as a part of our revamped schedule Great Escape (formerly known as Charisma) will take us to Santa Barbara Island instead. We did our first trip with Great Escape on 2-3 November 1996 to Cortes Banks. The new owners are friendly, knowledgeable and extremely accommodating. Consequently, we're anticipating a very pleasurable trip.

As most of you experienced divers know, Santa Barbara diving provides the very best in underwater topography, marine life, and generally high visibility. Sea lions abound and are always ready to "play". Black sea bass have been sighted on numerous occasions as have relatively large rays. The reefs are ideal for photography or just looking. Typically we will circumnavigate this relatively small island to pick off four or five choice spots.

For the game takers there are a variety of fish, scallops, and a smattering of lobster. Diving conditions in February are usually pleasant and typically the ocean is cooperative. This dive is suitable for all skill levels. Beginners should check with our diversaster to ascertain the specifics of each dive. Great Escape is one of the largest dive boat in the L.A. area and provides an extremely comfortable diving platform. The "verandah"

ESCAPE TO CORTES


Made the Grand Slam this year with the *Great Escape* (a.k.a. *Charisma*) run to Cortes Bank. Saturday dawned just beautiful with bright sun, clear skies and a flat ocean. Cortes was still a couple of hours away but who cared! We arrived and anchored over the 9-spot which is on the southwest portion of the bank. Needless to say the reef came up to about 55 feet then dropped away to near 100 feet. Visibility was in the 50-60 feet range, no current or surge and a 'balmy' 60°F temperature. Bugs there were, not many and a lot of kids and short adults. Scallops were there but few and far between. For photophiles and lookyloos great!

We moved east for the second dive closer to the buoy. Depths to 80 feet with slightly reduced visibility and some surge above 40 feet. Same bug results. Nice canyons and reef formations. The third spot was adjacent to the wreck *Abalonia* a constant source of bugs. Surge was a major factor as it nearly always is. Entry into the wreck was more than sporty - most, if not all, chose not to. IF you were into FLYING this was your dive!!! Some discussion followed with skipper/owner Roy K. as to whether to stay at Cortes - "for as long as you want, overnight if you're so inclined" - or retreat to San Clemente. We chose to stay for one more dive then decide. Dive four in up to 50 feet of ocean was also surgy and things were picking up.

The run to San Clemente was about 4 hours. We arrived there about 8:00 p.m. and anchored in Seal Cove. Dinner had already been served and the night divers were anxious to bug hunt. Diving was "OK", with few bugs observed, none taken. Depths to 45 feet in 20-30 feet visibility and 59°F water. Sometime during the night rock and roll set in causing a short move for *Great Escape* into a better lee spot. Sunday dawned gray with some fairly healthy swells 8-10 feet or so outside the anchorage. So much for diving 4-1/2 Fathom and the like. We plunged towards the west end with several on board feeling the effects, especially those that chose to party, some until late!! We tucked into West Cove on the backside and found divable water. At up to 55 feet on depth the 58°F water was calm, little surge and not bad visibility at about 30 feet. Lots and lots of bug kids, teenagers and new adults. One almost felt sorry for these guys with no mums, dads or grandparents!! The second dive was about one half mile south east in similar conditions. More kids etc. Several 3-3/16s were caught and released. The third and final dive was on the frontside just south and east of Northwest Harbor. Much the same for conditions and less bugs all around, but a nice spot.

In summary our first trip on the *Great Escape* was not outstanding from a diving point of view although we did make Cortes. The owners, both on board, were VERY accommodating, the crew very helpful and friendly and the food fare above average. Saturday dinner was excellent. Rhonda from the *Atlantis* is the cook and always works from scratch - hard work for one person on a boat this big. She worked 16 hours Saturday!!! Anyhow, this will be our boat of choice to replace *Atlantis*, *Encore*, and *Charisma* (sort of), in 1997. The Exec Committee will decide the final cut at the November meeting. Nice to have a full boat for once!!! Thanks.



LA BUFADORA AFTERMATH November 8-10, 1996

Six divers and four bubble-watchers ventured south to La Bufadora for a weekend of quality diving and fun. This was the first club trek down south in several years and the gods smiled upon us the entire weekend. Friday morning the Kalohi's and Nesheim's drove down and just past Tijuana and encountered the most wicked Santa Ana's blowing from the east. We hoped it would not be this way at La Bufadora but the winds stopped just north of Ensenada. We pulled in and checked with the dive shop on the cliff and within an hour were in the skiff and heading into the 6 inch surf.

The first dive was just north outside the bay at one of the white guano pinnacles. The surge was still with us even though the seas were the flattest we have ever encountered in this area. Visibility was good - 30 feet with some murkiness in the distance and water temperature ranged in the mid to upper 50s. The sun was shining all three days which made the photographers of the group quite happy. The second dive was along a wall south of the bay along the coastline. Again a great photo spot and a lot of surge. That evening (Friday) the rest of the group showed up and we all stayed in the house available for rent except for one brave man.

Saturday morning we all went out in one skiff and dove two southern pinnacles - one submerged and one with at least 3 feet exposed at high tide. Both were again hot spots for photographers and those who wanted scallops found them easily. The 3 photographers of the group were so impressed with the conditions that we did another afternoon skiff dive. Just as we were coming in from the third and fourth dive of the day, the others were just leaving to do some shopping in Ensenada and have dinner. They returned in time to see the dying campfire Joe Kalohi had built and enjoy the clear sky and multitude of stars.

Sunday morning we again had the skiff to ourselves and decided to try some of the pinnacles almost to the point of Punta Banda. The first spot had even cleaner water and scallop hunters came back happy. The second pinnacle had a lot more shear wall with tons of marine life fighting for space - color everywhere! When we came back to the beach we started packing up our gear while John and Rebecca Mowrey and friends cleaned scallop shells - they did good. Traffic was not too bad heading back north and the Santa Ana's had died. It was a wonderful weekend of diving and getting together with other club members.

If any of you want to go down to La Bufadora on your own, call me and I will give you any information I may know to help you out. The diving can be wonderful!

HOW ABOUT A WRECK DIVE?

The following account is an excerpt from an article entitled "The Good, the Bad, and the Just Plain Ugly" in the October 1996 edition of In Depth / Undercurrent.

Burton E. Fineberg found that Dive BVI offered a unique dive trip while he was staying at Little Dix Bay in August 1996 — wreck diving on his dive boat. "The boat was a 31-foot Bertram Sport Fisherman; seven divers, captain, and divemaster. Took 10 minutes for divers to get into the water and drift line was only long enough of three people; the rest of us bobbed in the water. Everyone aboard went down, leaving the boat unattended. Twenty-five minutes into the dive, I saw what looked like our dive boat sitting on the bottom of the ocean. I thought I was imagining the whole thing, but then I saw something float out of the boat. Once on the surface, some divers decided to go back down to retrieve their belongings. I inflated my BC and bobbed in very rough seas. After 10 minutes, I was picked up by a boat that had been anchored at a close site. We were later told that the bilge pumps were left on when we all entered the water and no one remained on the boat to watch what was happening. I have been diving in Cozumel, Caymans, Bonaire, Curacao, Hawaii, Ft. Lauderdale, and Aruba, and they all left someone on their boats."

Great Escape - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

ub member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.
