The 1996/97 lobster season is drawing to a close, the 1997 abalone season opens 1 March 1997. The trip is on our 22nd Street boat *Great Escape* (a.k.a. *Charisma*). We'll be searching once more for the elusive and wily bugs. The weather has turned quite good and we hope to get to the island in the early (still dark) timeframe to get in one night and three or four daylight dives. Those interested should bring fresh chem lights and at least one dive light. Red abalone, are also fairly abundant in some spots around San Nicolas and they don't move nearly so fast as those bugs do!! But you need to recognize the various species however, so you don't violate the present sport fishing regulations - only reds are legal again this season.

For those of us that are not so lucky or skilled at the lobster or abalone stakes, fish provide a nice alternative with many different species to spear. Although not the prettiest underwater environment, San Nicolas can provide excellent opportunities for video or photography. The boat will depart at 11:00 p.m. on Friday. Diving around San Nicolas is suitable for all skill levels with ocean cooperation. Relative beginners should check with the diversaster on duty before making a deep or potentially difficult dive. Call Kathy (Kalohi) at (310) 719-1816 for sign-ups and additional information. Bunks will be preassigned on a first pay/space available basis.

The *Great Escape* will take us from 22nd Street to Farnsworth Banks and other pinnacles and reefs on the back and front sideS of Catalina. This dive proves to be very popular and we have not scheduled Farnsworth since 1993 so early sign-up is a must.

Farnsworth Banks is on the backside of Catalina about 1.3 miles off Ben Western Point. The Banks are about 1100 yards by 600 yards, with the shallowest pinnacles at 55 to 75 feet. The spectacular walls descend to well over 100 feet. Farnsworth is famous for its protected unique coral which is the deep purple color contrasting with other colonies of coral, such as at Santa Barbara, which tend to be pink, red, or orange. Some of the colonies of coral are over 15 inches in diameter, and the whole visual effect adds immeasurably to the beauty of Farnsworth, both to the eye and the lens of your camera, still photo and/or video. Large fish, which are not protected, inhabit the area so you spear folks may collect a nice bounty.

This is a spectacular dive and under perfect conditions can be dived by intermediate level divers and above. Under less than perfect conditions, this is an advanced dive at all such times. However, following the Farnsworth dive we will proceed to at least three other shallower pinnacles or reefs, suitable for all skill levels (especially you folks who have not been diving through the winter!), around the West End of Catalina. Although not as abundant as the other islands, scallops are available to the persistent gameperson. Note there are NO red abalone at Catalina.

As is now typical of all Sea Diver charters, the trip includes air, food, snacks, and beverages. Call Kathy (Kalohi) at (310) 719-1816 for immediate sign-up. Farnsworth is the closest world class dive to 22nd Street. Come along -- check out a our all inclusive prices against anyone!!

- One More Success -

The 5th Underwater CleanUp activity in the Redondo Beach King Harbor complex again attracted almost 200 divers and almost 100 surface support personnel. Including sponsors, donators, and organization personnel we had about 400 people involved which is essentially the same as in the last two events. We did succeed in overall sponsorship and were thus able to maintain our donation to the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber from \$2500 in 1992 through \$5000 in 1993 to \$6000 in 1994, 1995, and this year. Great Escape - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks
