




IN AFFILIATION WITH AMERICAN DIVING

As you may already have heard, the 8th Redondo Beach King Harbor Underwater CleanUp scheduled for 11 June '00 has been cancelled. We were unfortunately forced into the decision as a result of extremely slow sign-ups. Only two weeks before the event, and one week before registration was to end, we had only 18 sign-ups (1 donation, 2 surface workers and 15 divers). We are not sure why but we will do a post mortem in order to try to understand the issues. Last year, after we moved the event from October to May, sign-ups dropped 20 to 25% and extrapolating this year would indicate at least another 25 to 35% drop off. With potentially less than 100 divers the event does not "hang together". My sincere thanks to the CleanUp Committee, the folks who did sign-up and to AES for their continuing excellent support.

JUNE ENTERTAINMENT

PETER LANDECKER - ADVENTURES IN THE GALAPAGOS

Our very own world renowned traveler Peter Landecker will present June's Program on his Galapagos Adventures. Peter has logged over 1100 dives and almost 1000 underwater hours in 27 countries since 1975, with most of his dives in Southern California. Previews of a few of his Galapagos images can be found from <http://www.netword.com/landecker>.

What did he see diving in the Galapagos? On one dive near Darwin's Arch, he saw hundreds of scalloped hammerhead sharks (tens as close as a few feet away) and about 100 Galapagos sharks, followed by a group of about 100 dolphins (zipping by only a few feet away). On another dive he saw 1000 barracuda, turtles, white tipped sharks and very friendly sea lions. There were incredible cuts, holes, currents, and schools of fish as far as the eye could see. Peter logged 12 dives in 5 days of diving (7 days on the 90 foot long dive boat *Reina Silva*) with 14.2 hours of bottom time. The water temperature was 66-75 °F. The visibility was in the range 40-80 feet.

Land excursions on the Galapagos Islands were fascinating! There were sea lions (with babies checking him out and sniffing his feet), blue footed boobies (some only inches away), marine iguanas, Galapagos penguins, and a Galapagos hawk. Peter saw 500 pound Galapagos tortoises at Darwin Station as well as mating in the wild. The volcanic landscape was awesome!

Peter also spend 4 nights in Quito and took land excursions to very interesting country crafts markets, museums and churches.

This trip in January 2000 lasted 12 days and cost about \$3700 for everything, during which time he crossed the equator at least 8 times! There was one revolution (and change of government) during this trip. Peter will relate his experiences with a video and slides to illustrate his "adventure of a lifetime".

I don't believe as a Club, we have dived Osborne Bank before. Osborne is a deep advanced dive, with the basic plateau at approximately 130 feet. Surrounding the plateau are depths that go way beyond normal sport diving limits, so extreme care in depth control is required. Nitrogen narcosis is likely to occur, to some degree, on this dive. The plateau itself is essentially flat and provides an environment somewhat different than the more typical reefs in the area. We strongly recommend no spear fishing unless you are extremely comfortable at these depths. Distractions can be dangerous.

Following the Osborne Bank dive we will move to Santa Barbara Island for the rest of our diving. As most of you experienced divers know, Santa Barbara diving provides the very best in underwater topography, marine life, and generally high visibility. Sea lions abound and are always ready to 'play'. Black sea bass have been sighted on numerous occasions as have relatively large rays, sometimes in "flying formations". The reefs are ideal for photography, video, or just looking. We will circumnavigate this relatively small island to pick off three or four choice spots, including one or two in the environs of Sutil Island. This is excellent diving.

For the game takes there are a variety of fish and scallops. Diving conditions in June are usually pleasant and typically the ocean is cooperative. *Great Escape* is one of the largest dive boats in the L.A. area and provides an extremely comfortable diving platform. The "verandah" (a.k.a. sun deck) also provides for sun and relaxation on the way home. Our second two-day dive of 2000 is a great southern outer island cruise and dive to the very best spots. This Friday/Saturday affair has been the making of really outstanding trips in past years.

Begg Rock is a group of pinnacles which rise about 15 feet above the water and then plunge in the most spectacular fashion to over 100 feet with rolling ledges from 30 feet to 60 feet. The rock is located about 7 miles north of San Nicolas Island, and is noted for its huge plate-sized scallops on the deeper ledges (easy to limit out at the one-day limit of 10). Photophiles and video buffs will be well served. Relative beginners should note that Begg Rock is fully exposed to the ocean, but on good days may be dived by all skill levels after appropriate pre-dive consultation with the divemaster and a properly planned dive, with your buddy.

San Nicolas, the outer most of the southern four islands, is noted for its relative remoteness and typically large size fish. Ocean temperatures should be up around 60°F, making diving pleasant. Large fish, such as Calico Bass, Sheephead, etc., can be found in the kelp beds and reefs. We will overnight at San Nicolas, probably in Dutch Harbor, with full dinner, socialize with good friends, and enjoy a typically great evening just relaxing. The following day we will either head to Begg Rock for our second attempt, or cruise to Santa Barbara Island, which is the smallest prettiest island and has a little of everything. The spectacular underwater arches, walls, reefs, sea lions, and other sea life are great for photography and video and visibility is usually exceptional. Again large fish surround the area, including the occasional black sea bass (these are for viewing only!!!).

BOUILLABAISSE AFTERMATH

IT WAS COLD!!!

The Club two-day trip on the *Peace* is always in the coldest water of the year. This year was no exception! After a somewhat bumpy ride, we anchored about mid-point of the south side of Santa Cruz Island around 2:30 AM. After dawn we motored to Morse Point on the south-west tip of Santa Cruz. Water temperature in the low 50's °F and poor visibility, due to plankton blooms, were to plague the first day's diving of six dives total. We also had some wind and surface chop to contend with. Best dive of the six was the second dive at Gull Island, where there was no current, only a slight surface chop and visibility to about 35 feet. The remaining four dives were on the north side of Santa Cruz tucked into a succession of weather and surge protected coves which all tended to "look the same". In order they were: West Grotto, Quail Rock, Fern Grotto, and an un-named cove west of Pelican Bay. Not the greatest of diving but the best we could do. The day was beautiful with warm clear sunny skies but with wind whenever not tucked in.

With a promise of better ocean conditions for Saturday, we were still optimistic for San Miguel. Skipper / owner Eric B. came through, running along the north side of Santa Cruz, down the Santa Cruz Channel, along the south side of Santa Rosa, then north to the south side of San Miguel. Lots of chop and some surge with flapping kelp. Clear skies forecast another bright sunny day. We made for dives on a tight schedule. Wyckoff Ledge, Judith Rock, Tyler Bight and a spot halfway between Tyler Bight and Wyckoff Ledge. Water temperature was between 46°F and 49°F. COLD! Visibility was typically in the 30-35 feet region. Apart from the cold water it was good diving, with depths to 100 feet plus in most cases. Diving done we made a late start back to Ventura arriving at the dock close to 7:00 PM. All in all considering the conditions, we did pretty good.

Awards we had. Prime "Michael Kane Tech Diver Extraordinaire" (formerly "booby") prize went to Kathleen T. for dropping her tank fair and square on her dive computer destroying the liquid crystal, and for making a less than graceful deck entry. Back up MKTDE prize went to Scott R. for leaving his dry suit out overnight and allowing it to fill with sea water. The ballsy award went to Ms. Terry S. who not only was the only individual to make all four of the frigid San Miguel dives but she did it in a wet suit.

Given the weather conditions, the *Peace* did the best they could and as always the food was excellent and the crew very helpful and outgoing. Nice cold trip.

GLACD & LACUIA ROCKS, RIPS, AND REEFS 3R's Program - 2000

The Greater Los Angeles Council of Divers (GLACD) and the Los Angeles County Underwater Instructor's Association (LACUIA) have joined forces to produce an entire series of courses designed to safely introduce divers to popular, local dive sites.

Conducted by certified Scuba Instructors, the Rocks, Rips, and Reefs course includes a short educational seminar covering safe beach diving skills, certain aspects of the local marine environment, and other valuable site-specific information. The seminar is followed by an in-water demonstration and practice session that includes a skin diving tour of the actual dive site.

Topics and skills covered in the course include:

- ◆ safe entry and exit skills
- ◆ identifying, anticipating, and navigating hidden obstacles in the surf zone
- ◆ how to use the ocean's natural wave motion to your advantage
- ◆ how to read the ocean's surface
- ◆ using tide tables to plan a dive
- ◆ choosing appropriate entry and exit points
- ◆ how to find cool stuff at each location

Participants are required to wear a full wetsuit, mask, snorkel, and fins. A weight belt with no more than half of the normal diving weight is optional. Tanks and regulators are not allowed during the program, but may be brought along if you plan to make a dive after the class is over. After completing the in-water practice, we finish the session with a noon time Bar-B-Que, so bring along a picnic lunch and plan on socializing afterwards.

SCUBA certification is not required in order to participate in the 3R's courses!

Great Escape - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.


