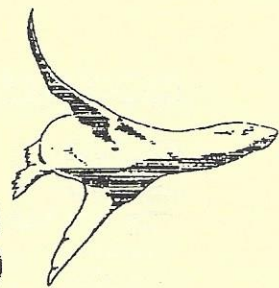

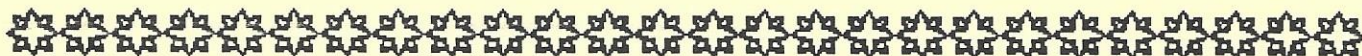
## FROM THE EXECUTIVE ISSUES...

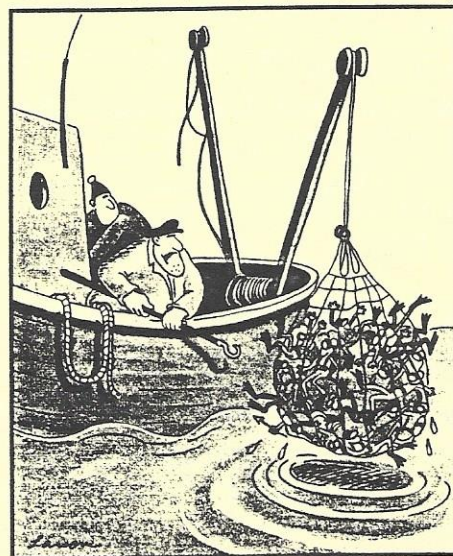
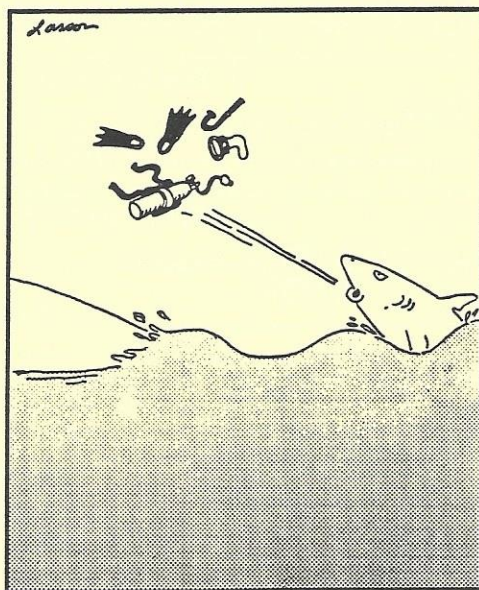

Our second two-day dive of 2000 is a great southern outer island cruise and dive to the very best spots. This Friday/Saturday affair has been the making of really outstanding trips in past years.

Begg Rock is a group of pinnacles which rise about 15 feet above the water and then plunge in the most spectacular fashion to over 100 feet with rolling ledges from 30 feet to 60 feet. The rock is located about 7 miles north of San Nicolas Island, and is noted for its huge plate-sized scallops on the deeper ledges (easy to limit out at the one-day limit of 10). Photophiles and video buffs will be well served. Relative beginners should note that Begg Rock is fully exposed to the ocean, but on good days may be dived by all skill levels after appropriate pre-dive consultation with the divemaster and a properly planned dive, with your buddy.

San Nicolas, the outer most of the southern four islands, is noted for its relative remoteness and typically large size fish. Ocean temperatures should be up around 60°F, making diving pleasant. Large fish, such as Calico Bass, Sheephead, etc., can be found in the kelp beds and reefs. We will overnight at San Nicolas, probably in Dutch Harbor, with full dinner, socialize with good friends, and enjoy a typically great evening just relaxing. The following day we will either head to Begg Rock for our second attempt, or cruise to Santa Barbara Island, which is the smallest prettiest island and has a little of everything. The spectacular underwater arches, walls, reefs, sea lions, and other sea life are great for photography and video and visibility is usually exceptional. Again large fish surround the area, including the occasional black sea bass (these are for viewing only!!!).

## NEAR PERFECT CONDITIONS

The ocean was flat calm, perfect for oil rig diving. Under typical early AM overcast, the first wave of divers entered the waters adjacent to oil rig *Eureka* at about 8:30 AM. Visibility was good at 30 – 40 feet down to about 80 feet depth, at which point a bloom reduced visibility to 20 - 25 feet. Below 120 feet or so clear set in but so did dark. Several divers went below 150 feet with attendant minor deco stops on the way back. *Eureka* is in over 800 feet of water – “no” bottom. The marine growth on these oil rigs is incredible and to a great extent remains undisturbed except for the scallop population which is still very plentiful. Water temperature was in the mid-60’s, higher at the surface lower at depth with a noticeable thermocline at about 85 feet. We made two dives on *Eureka* before moving to the *Elly/Ellen* double, by which time the sun was out and hot.

*Elly* was the first choice with conditions much the same as *Eureka* but with less visibility. Growth is not as spectacular as on *Eureka* but still impressive. Scallops may actually be slightly larger overall. The final dive was on *Ellen* but by now the wind was up creating surface chop and more difficulties for maneuvering the live boat. We were back at the dock before 4:00 PM.

We made two “Michael H. Kane Tech Diver Extraordinaire” Awards. The first to Erik S. who allowed his tank to do a double gainer off the bench onto the deck destroying his inflator hose. The second to Chris C. who did much the same thing, with no apparent damage, but who recovered quickly and thought he was home free. Somebody snitched!! Each got a CleanUp t-shirt. The *Great Escape* did a nice job throughout, great all around team, and with near perfect conditions. Great stuff.

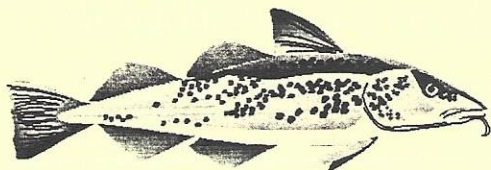

## JUST PER PLAN

The Club's (to my knowledge) first charter to Osborne Bank went pretty much per plan. After some last minute issues with a second skipper for *Great Escape* we arrived at Osborne at around 6:30 AM under overcast skies but with a flat calm ocean. After anchoring, John D. was to make a scout dive to make sure we were close to the edge of the Osborne plateau. After a false start against a noticeable current, John's cup floated to the surface indicating we were there. Divers were sent off in buddy teams every two minutes or so. This did not quite solve the C.F. Factor, as the anchor line became "clogged". On descending we reached about 150 feet before realizing that the 130 foot plateau was somewhat off and up to the right. Visibility was excellent at about 50 feet with aslight current. It was dark and deep but the temperature was a comfortable 61°F at depth. Not much game but nice standings of purple coral. The anchor and the bottom were around 170 feet. After much hanging-off/decompression all returned to the boat safe and sound.

We moved into Santa Barbara Island anchoring on the outside of Sutil. Great dive spot with deep straight walled canyons and depths to over 100 feet. There was a 10° - 15°F thermocline at around 100 feet. Visibility was 50 to 60 feet with no current. There was a slight surge on the reef top which was around 45 feet in depth. Temperature was a mild 63°F.

The third dive was off Arch Point. Very disappointing as the brittle stars had pretty much taken over what once was a great dive area. Visibility again was in the 50 to 60 feet region. The final and fourth dive was about 150 yards off the west side of the island in 45 to 50 feet of water. Although not much to see, visibility was over 75 feet. Nice final dive.

Diving over we began the four plus hour run back to San Pedro. Aside from a "cat and mouse" with a large freighter the run was smooth and uneventful.

MHKTDE Awards were made. The first to Tammy L. for losing a fin and apparently swimming in a circular motion and the second to John G. Sr. for losing a significant portion of a brand new high power light system. The ever present John D. received The One The Only Ever (to date) Sea Diver Lifetime Achievement Award which was a "Diving for Dummies" book complete with a PADI Open Water CD!!

The *Great Escape* did a great job all around with excellent crew support and making all the spots just per plan, with a nice sunny day to boot.

There were two boat dives, the *Peace* to Wilson Rock at \$36 non-inclusive and the *Westerly* to Catalina at \$23 non-inclusive. The beach dive was a Pismo Beach Campout over the 4 July weekend. ## DIVE BOAT NEWS

- The *Great Escape* suffered extensive damage to the port side rudder, prop, drive shaft, strut and bottom when it struck a rock, at full speed, in the channel between Santa Barbara Island and Sutil, Sunday 4 June – the day after our Oil Rig dive. The boat was in the yard for \_\_\_\_\_. The damage was somewhat worse than that suffered in July '95, also at Santa Barbara, on a Sea Diver two day trip on the then *Charisma*. Damage in that case was also on the port side, with minor prop damage to the starboard side. On that occasion we returned home on the slightly vibrating starboard only. Observing the recent damage, (see [www.diveboat.com/dave\\_finds\\_hard\\_water/](http://www.diveboat.com/dave_finds_hard_water/)) it was definitely another starboard return run!!
- Will L. reported that the infamous *Wild Wave* is residing in Santa Cruz Harbor as a fishing boat. *Wild Wave* was one of a kind as was skipper Mickey Pittman and later Joel Ingram. Wild, wild times on a boat appropriately named!! \*Prices are all inclusive (air, food, and beverages). Non-members add \$10 for single day and \$15 for two-day dives. New members paying full annual membership allowed one single day dive at approximately two-thirds of member price. Dive 00-C12 does not include air, food, and beverages. All dives except 00-C12 are limited load of 28 divers.

### Great Escape - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

### Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

## DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.

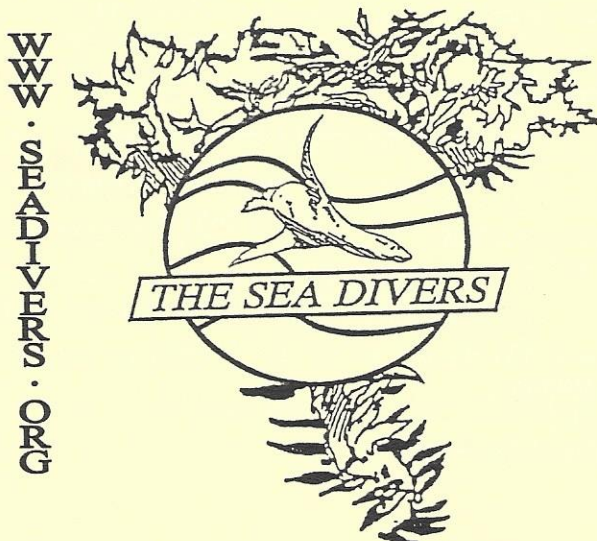
