OLYMPIC WRECK and OIL RIG EUREKA

This will be the club's first combined wreck and oil rig dive. For this single day charter, we plan to dive the *Olympic*, which is a relatively deep dive, then proceed to oil rig *Eureka*, which can be a shallower dive or a deeper dive!

We will leave the dock at 7:00 AM sharp and head out to the *Olympic* some 3-1/2 miles out from the San Pedro Light at L.A. Harbor. The *Olympic* was built in Belfast, Ireland, and launched in 1877 as the *Star of France*. She was an iron hulled, square-rigged bark of 1,644 tons, 258 feet long and 38 feet wide. Some 63 years later she was rammed amid ships by the *Sakito Maru* about 7:00 AM on 4 September 1940, and sank within minutes with 17 of 24 on board surviving. The *Olympic* lies essentially on the starboard side in about 100 feet of water. The highest part of the bow is about 70 feet below the surface with the bowsprit extending out over the sandy bottom. The midship section is approximately parallel to the sand and is in relatively poor shape, however, mast stubs are visible, as is the deck pump and its large spoked wheels. Also, if you spend a little time on the port side, you can still see the remains of the huge "V", cut by the *Sakito Maru*. The top of the stern is about 80 feet below the surface and this section is between 40 and 50 feet long. The whole wreck is covered with strawberry anemones. It is a fascinating dive.

For the second time in this year we are taking the *Great Escape* to dive an oil rig off the Huntington Beach area. Earlier this year our oil rig dives were both outstanding & spectacular. After the *Olympic* dive we will head out to *Eureka*, the furthest and deepest of the oil rigs. Once in place (live boat!) the first of several groups of divers will enter the water to explore the below surface rig structure and the attendant sea life. In particular scallops will be of significant interest to the game takers. Video and photography opportunities are excellent and quite different from the normal reef diving. It is imperative that all divers watch their depth and bottom times as this rig is in extremely deep water and although the legs are a good reference in what would otherwise be a blue water situation, it's easy to lose track. Also this dive follows the deep dive on the *Olympic*. As divers surface, they should group up with other surfaced divers, such that the boat can pick up a group at a time, not individual divers.

All in all this is something different. As of this writing the boat is full, with a wait list forming, but remember wait lists do erode. As is typical of all Sea Diver charters, the trip includes air, food, snacks, and beverages and has a limited load of 28 divers. The planned *Peace* itinerary will take us out to San Miguel Island -- as always, weather permitting. We will loop around the south side of Santa Rosa picking off dives as we progress westward towards San Miguel, or weather permitting we'll run straight to San Miguel.

After crossing the San Miguel Passage, onto the south side of San Miguel, we'll dive Crook Point, Wychoff Ledge, and Tyler Bight which are all great spots for photography. We will then circle around the west or the east side of the island for one or more dives before overnighting in Cuyler Harbor.

Second day, or even on the first day weather permitting, we would hope to tackle Richardson's Rock, Boomerang or Wilson Rock or, failing that, we will probably dive the lee side of Prince Island. Then we'll begin the run back to the mainland stopping for dives along the north side of San Miguel either at Harris Point or in Simonton Cove.

This two-day will provide excellent opportunities for game (fish and scallops) and all kinds of photogenic sea life. Overall there will be dives for all skill levels, although, the major pinnacles are considered to be strong intermediate to advanced dives in all but near perfect conditions.

The *Peace* is a great boat just to be on -- diving or not!! Cabrillo Chocolate Lobster Dive - September 23

The 3rd Annual Cabrillo Chocolate Lobster Dive will occur on Saturday, September 23, 2000. Both certified scuba divers and skin divers will be able to descend into the waters off Cabrillo Beach located at San Pedro in search of a rare species of lobster (the 8-inch chocolate variety) known to appear only once a year—this year on September 23.

The event is limited to 500 participants who will be eligible to win dozens of valuable and exciting prizes provided by dive equipment manufacturers and other sponsors, while keeping their bag limit (2) of recovered lobster. Proceeds from the event benefit Cabrillo Marine Aquarium's Spring Outdoor Classroom, teaching 36,000 children annually about the marine environment.

Girlfriend's Calls Lead to 'Dead' Man

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—A man was accused Wednesday of faking his death in a scuba diving accident off the Florida Keys to collect on a \$1-million life insurance policy.

Kerry Steven Scheele, 29, was arrested in Beloit, Wis., and faces extradition to Florida. He was charged with application fraud, claims fraud and first- and third-degree grand theft.

Scheele led his estranged wife and others to believe he drowned during a lobster diving trip in August, according to Insurance Commissioner Bill Nelson.

Investigators later tracked him down through phone records linked to a girlfriend.

Investigators said Scheele named the girlfriend as beneficiary on a \$1-million life insurance policy. She left Monroe County, Fla., within days after his reported drowning, but not before making a number of long-distance calls, investigators said.

JUST TWELVE YEARS AGO...

The President was Allen Parker (!), Treasurer Kathi McNally and Secretary Sandi Anderson.. General Meetings were held at Baxter's and the Executive Meetings were also at Baxter's, although we were about to drop Baxter's for the General Meeting. The boat dive was on the *Wild Wave* to Gull Island, Santa Cruz and Anacapa during the *Wild Wave* annual vacation to Ventura Harbor. The Club was organizing a trip to the Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber, which for an extra \$20, one could "dive" in the chamber to 165 feet. Big issue of the moment was the Sea Otter translocation plan and Fish and Wildlife's (now Fish and Game) attempt to persuade the Navy to close San Nicolas Island to dive charter boats. Fortunately, the Navy dragged it's feet, the Sea Otters were translocated unsuccessfully and diving continued. Most of the Sea Otters either swam back to the mainland, got lost, died, or were otherwise "eliminated". One Sea Otter was plucked from re-hab at the Monterey Aquarium, equipped with a transmitter and hauled off to San Nicolas. After being placed in the ocean he immediately turned North

This picture of a Harbor Seal is very special to me. I've been waiting for a long time to interact with seals, and this little guy gave me my opportunity.

We were out at Catalina Island on the *Vision* for a four-day photo trip. It was Saturday, February 5th and we were anchored at Johnson Rocks. It was the first dive of the day and I was first one in the water. Maybe that's why I got this chance. I'd like to believe that anyway.

The water was clear and there was lots of kelp. I was at about 30 feet when this cute little fellow came along. At first I wasn't sure what he wanted, but after a time it was obvious he loved divers and just came over to check everything out. He was like a big puppy. In my face, begging me to scratch him.

As the other divers entered the water he also greeted them. Everyone who dove that spot got to play with this seal.

I used my wide-angle 20mm lens. I'm looking down at the seal as he looks up to smile at the camera. This was my first great experience with a seal but I hope I have more opportunities to catch some smiling seals in the future.

Great Escape - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.


