FROM THE EXECUTIVE MEETING (Continued from September)...

As a result of inputs we received on our new Policy and Club Waiver, minor changes have been made to those published in the September Newsletter (see Revisions "A" inside). On the Policy Statement, items 2) and 4) will only apply when the Nitrox mix exceeds 40%. On the Waiver Item 4) the wording has been changed to read "...use Nitrox (maximum 40% mix) under the ..." The 40% mix is the maximum allowed under normal diversater insurance policies. There are very few diversaters insured for mixes in excess of 40% and we do not believe that mixes in excess of 40% are typically in use for primary gas supply. Hopefully these minor changes will clarify both the Policy Statement and the Club Waiver. THIS IS IT!!



In order to get in a relatively early lobster season club dive we are trying this unusual two-day mid-week charter on the Peace. We will be diving San Nic's North West reefs and high spots for monster bugs. Legend has it that when the bugs are as big as the boat they spew fire. In fact once upon a short time ago, one of these legendary monsters climbed atop the Peace diveboat while the boat was making the channel crossing from Nic to Talcott. The beast was aptly named "BugZilla" by second captain Bob McClurg who saw it first. Bob went out for a smoke one evening and the fire breathing lobster was climbing up the stern, it flamed Bob immediately and lit his cigarette too! Bob's hair was singed and some it still has not grown back. Captain Eric took quick action by tossing anything at hand at BugZilla. First went Roger's potato pancakes but BugZilla ate those faster than 28 divers ever could and simply returned another fire breathing belch. Sue Swindell jumped into the fray by trying to push it into the ocean, as if she thought it was it's birthday and it would simply let itself be pushed in like the rest of the crew. However, she narrowly missed it's menacing jaws and was only to be pushed back. She was held at bay in the galley by the beast's numerous legs. Next went Fidel's Boutique stash of shirts, patches and hats which where used to put out the small fires that were beginning to take hold on the boat. Finally from a dusty shoe box buried under charts and maps came ol' Capt. Bills "Rawhide" cassette tape. In the past this was played to get people off the boat and it worked well. If BugZilla cannot be found on our adventure then we will take the women and children lobsters, leaving only the short ones. We will have an aggressive dive schedule. Gate

times will be limited and we will get as many dives in as possible. Up to 9 dives the first day and 4 the second. If you are familiar with the *Peace* "Animal" trips then you should get the picture, the plan is the same. Dive early, dive often.

If you limit early the Lingcod and other game fish that are found at Nic and Talcott will keep your attention. For the Lobster, there were plenty 8+ pound bugs taken at Nic and Talcott during last year's season, the largest was over 10 lb. from Nic. Take a couple of days off and join us on a dive in search of BugZilla.

More World Class diving for us all! Tanner Bank and Cortes Bank, both on one trip on Great Escape!!

Both Banks are near the Mexican border and are typically deep dives, especially Tanner Bank. They are 70 to 80 miles SSW of 22nd Street Landing and about 35 to 40 miles SW of China Point on San Clemente Island and roughly west of San Diego. As exposed dive spots, they are not dived as much as other Southern California areas.

Tanner Bank is a deep 100 feet plus plateau and is known for its large red, pink, and purple hydrocoral formations, large fish, especially rockfish and cabezon. Schools of tuna, yellowtail and other species are not uncommon. This is definitely one of the most spectacular and unusual dives in Southern California. The club has not dived Tanner in many years, so this is your opportunity.

Cortes Bank is closer to the Mexican border and offers excellent diving. In addition to the large variety of fish, Cortes is home to a substantial lobster population, many of which can be fount inside the wreck of the *Abalonia*. Much less of a plateau than Tanner, it provides a greater variety of walls, crevices, plateaus, and some shallower depths at 30 feet or so.

Photo and video oriented divers will not be disappointed with the dive locations, especially Tanner Bank. Just cruising out there adds to the two days, especially if the sun graces us with it's presence.

This dive is a strong intermediate to advance dive due to the full exposure of both Banks to the ocean. However, relative beginners can make the dives, assuming ocean conditions relative to waves, surge and current are within the individual's capabilities. San Clemente will be our fallback, which is typically suitable for all skill levels. Consult the divemaster if in doubt about your capability versus observed conditions.

These are really outstanding dive areas. Chances to dive here are limited but we've been very successful in previous years at Cortes. Last year we were seriously weathered out for the two days. FANTABULOUS!

We entitled our pre-trip write-up on the *Peace* September two-day "Pinnacles Galore". How right we were. After a near flat calm straight shot we anchored over our first pinnacle, Boomerang, around 7:00 AM. From a bow gate exit, following the anchor line, brought divers to about 70 feet of water. Depths to too deep up to 55 feet or so were available. Visibility was in the 35-40 feet range above 70 or 80 feet then 50-60 feet below that. Small krill clouds were responsible for the shallower water reduced visibility. There was no current and the temperature was 57°-58°F at the surface and three to five degrees cooler at depths, with a thermocline around 80 feet. Typical of all pinnacles in the area, full growth on the higher portions and less coverage below. Scallops were bigger deeper and more plentiful. Nice, nice dive.

We followed Boomerang with Richardson's Rock where conditions were the same except for more swells and a little more surface action. Then on to Wilson Rock. A Grand Slam on day one!! We closed out the day with dives off the west end of Castle Rock, Simonton Cove and Bat Rock at the entrance to Cuyler Harbor, our overnight anchorage. Fish were the primary order for the game takers on the last three dives including two nice sized halibut by Bob D. and another by Skipper Eric. The photographers had plenty of choices all day!!

Day two dawned as we cruised to another great pinnacle, Skyscraper. It's part of the Wilson Rock area where two skyscraper-like pinnacles rise to within 50 to 60 feet of the surface. Just another spectacular dive. Ho hum. Again conditions were near perfect and similar to day one. Next pinnacle conquered was Egg Rock, mid channel between San Miguel and Santa Rosa. Here the peak is closer to 40 feet below the surface, but greater depths were at hand. The final dive was on Little Wilson just off the edge of Talcott Shoal. Nice, nice spot and the culmination of two days of unbelievable pinnacle diving. Scallop limits for each of the two days were everywhere with most being of the larger variety. There was also more fish taken this trip than on any Sea Diver trip in recent memory. The photographers were smiling too.

For some reason this trip did not quite fill, very unusual for a *Peace* September dive. If you weren't on it you missed one of the very best dive trips we've had since I joined the Club 20 years ago.

We had no booby award, so no screw-ups. The only item of note was that both my primary computer (battery) and my back-up computer (several smacks around the head after changing the battery) refused to start before the first dive on the first day. The back-up regained consciousness just prior to the last dive the second day. Needless to say my attitude was not the best for the first dive but that soon changed. Peter L. claimed he misread his computer as listing him at 501 feet for 92 minutes – reading the computer from the correct orientation indicated a more believable 105 feet for 26 minutes.

The Peace and the crew did a fantastic job adding to a fantastic set of dives. So where were you other folks?

NITROX


Diving with the use of Nitrox is allowed on Sea Divers boat charters under the following conditions:

- 1) The diver must be an advanced diver and be fully certified, with proof, in the use of Nitrox.
- 2) The boat diversater must be certified and insured for Nitrox diving, when Nitrox mix exceeds 40%.
- 3) The boat policies and/or waiver(s) will apply.
- 4) Both The Sea Divers and the boat diversater must be informed one week prior to the charter, on the planned use of Nitrox when Nitrox mix exceeds 40%.
- 5) Tank mix tags must be available for diversater and/or Sea Diver's approval.
- 6) Only one tank will be placed at the dive station. Additional tanks must be stored elsewhere for later use.
- 7) The diver must sign a Sea Diver waiver, initialing Nitrox Dive in Item 4, prior to first time use of Nitrox on a Sea Diver Charter. Boat waivers must also be signed before diving begins.

TRIMIX

Diving with the use of Trimix is not allowed on Sea Divers boat charters.

SEA DIVERS WAIVER

Welcome to a Sea Divers' dive. It is your personal responsibility to follow these procedures on all Sea Divers sponsored dives. Please ask the Sea Divers Executive on board, or the divemaster if you need clarification.



- 1) All divers must have in their possession a SCUBA certification card and present it at the request of The Sea Divers or the diversaster.
- 2) A submersible pressure gauge, depth gauge, timing device/computer are required for all divers using SCUBA. A buoyancy compensator and power inflator are strongly recommended for use in buoyancy control.
- 3) The diversaster is the coordinator between the divers and the boat skipper on all boat dives. Divers are not to access the bridge.
- 4) Divers shall keep within the air no-decompression limits and to keep track of their dive profiles. A diver who exceeds the no-decompression limits should notify the divemaster and assumes all liability. Properly trained and certified divers may use Nitrox (maximum 40% mix) under the auspices of the charter boat divemaster/waiver(s). Pre-coordination is required with The Sea Divers and the divemaster for the use of mixes in excess of 40%. Divers agree to abide by all stated club policies. (Nitrox Dive _____
- 5) Divers must check in and out with the diverseter, who will log entry and exit times on the diving log.
- Roll calls are to be answered only by the person whose name has been called. 6)
- 7) All fish and game laws must be obeyed. A measuring device is required for taking abalone and/or lobster.
- 8) No diving is allowed under the influence of alcohol or drugs. No drinking of alcohol is permitted unless the individual diver has finished diving for the day. Drinking soon after diving may increase the likelihood of decompression sickness and is not recommended. We also recommend not drinking for 12 hours before diving. The divernaster has the authority to prohibit a diver from diving if he/she suspects any violation of this procedure.
- 9) A chem light or equivalent will be worn on all night dives.
- 10) The Sea Divers recommend and support the buddy system as a valuable tool in promoting safe and enjoyable diving. The divernaster will aid in matching up divers in buddy teams. The Sea Divers also strongly recommend each diver carry an alternative air source (Spare Air, Air II, octopus, pony, etc).
- Any diver who has not dived for (6) months or more MUST dive with a buddy or a buddy team



LEGISLATIVE REPORT - SB241

SB241 the Rigs to Reefs controversial bill has completed a slow agonizing death. Introduced in 1999 as a way to leave the underwater elements of closed oil rigs in place as an artificial reef it was rolled over as a two year bill into 2000. The first and most significant amendment was to also make the artificial reef a nature preserve, i.e. no fishing or (diver) disturbance. The bill was eventually amended eight times effectively killing any chance of passage and into the inactive file it went. Started out great, died on the vine! Someone is sure to introduce Son of SB241 but with so many differing and strong opinions Son of SB241 probably faces the same fate at SB241. Hopefully all this does not induce the oil rig operators to ban divers from diving operating rigs. It is a nice alliance

Great Escape - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.


