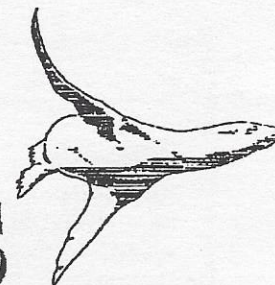

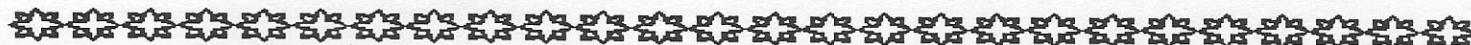

## APRIL GENERAL MEETING PETER PEHL – LONG BEACH AQUARIUM DIVING PROGRAMS

Peter Pehl is the Aquarium of the Pacific's Diving Safety Officer. He is responsible for overseeing the Aquarium's Dive Team of over 100 volunteer divers. The Aquarium of the Pacific in Long Beach is a non-profit organization dedicated to instilling a sense of wonder, respect, and stewardship for the Pacific Ocean and its inhabitants. To assist their staff in accomplishing this mission, they rely upon their volunteer divers to help maintain the exhibits, care for the animals, and perform underwater presentations for the visiting public.

To become a volunteer diver at the Aquarium of the Pacific, a person must be rescue certified, have logged a minimum of 50 open ocean dives, and submit a volunteer application. The Aquarium Diving Safety Officer reviews all applications to ensure the eligibility of the applicant and invites the qualified prospective volunteer to divers to an interview and diving skills check-out. Applicants that demonstrate that they meet the needs of the Aquarium are invited to become members of the Aquarium of the Pacific Volunteer Divers.

Peter has been a certified diver since May 1970. He is a graduate of U.S. Navy Second Class, First Class, and Saturation Deep-sea Diving Schools. During his twenty-three years of Naval Service, he participated in many diving operations, which included underwater ship repair, aircraft and ship salvage, special warfare and submarine support, and recompression chamber treatments. He also served on detached duty from the United States Navy with the British Royal Navy, in the capacity of Inspector of Diving for the RN. Upon his retirement from the US Navy in 1992 he was the Officer in Charge of the Naval School of Deep Diving Systems in San Diego, California. From August 1993 to December 1997, he was employed by the University of Southern California as the Diving Safety Officer and Waterfront Manager at the Wrigley Institute for Environmental Studies.

Peter is a member of the American Academy of Underwater Sciences, Association of Diving Contractors, Historical Diving Society. He is a certified instructor with the Professional Association of Diving Instructors, the National Association of Underwater Instructors, the American Red Cross, the American Safety and Health Institute, and the Diver's Alert Network. Peter holds a U.S. Coast Guard Masters license for 200-ton motor vessels, including towing craft.

Our next General Meeting is on Tuesday 3 April at Round Table Pizza in Hawthorne starting at 7:00 PM. Stop on by to hear Peter's fascinating discussion.

This single day springtime dive on the *Great Escape* will take us to the backside of San Clemente Island. We will run to Seal Cove or perhaps Lost Point to begin our diving. As the day progresses we'll work our way back North and West diving at the Four-and-a-Half fathom spot finishing up in the Castle Rock area. All of the areas on the backside typically have excellent reef structures with a multiplicity of growth and sea life. The walls and canyons are second to none in the local area and provide some of the most varied diving environs. Depths will range from 40 to over 100 feet with water temperature anticipated to be around 60°F.

The dive is suitable for all levels of skill, ocean conditions permitting. The backside does see it's fair share of swells and potentially rough water but this time of year should provide a good chance of success. Looky-loos and/or photographers will not be disappointed with the environs of San Clemente, and for the game takers, scallops and a goodly variety of fish are available. It will also be interesting to see if the Pink and Green abalone are showing any sign of recovery. Hopefully the sun will grace us with a nice warm spring day.

Weather permitting several of the pinnacles will feature on this charter.

Other great spots will include a selection on San Miguel from Bennett Point, Judith Rock, Tyler Bight, Wychoff Ledge, Simonton Cove and Harris Point. Potential spots at Santa Rosa will include South Point, Ford Point, Bechers Bay area and Talcott Shoal. As always we can tailor the choices based on weather and diver desires.

All of the areas should provide great opportunities for scallops and a variety of fish for the game takers and the very best for photography and/or video.

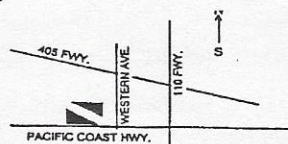

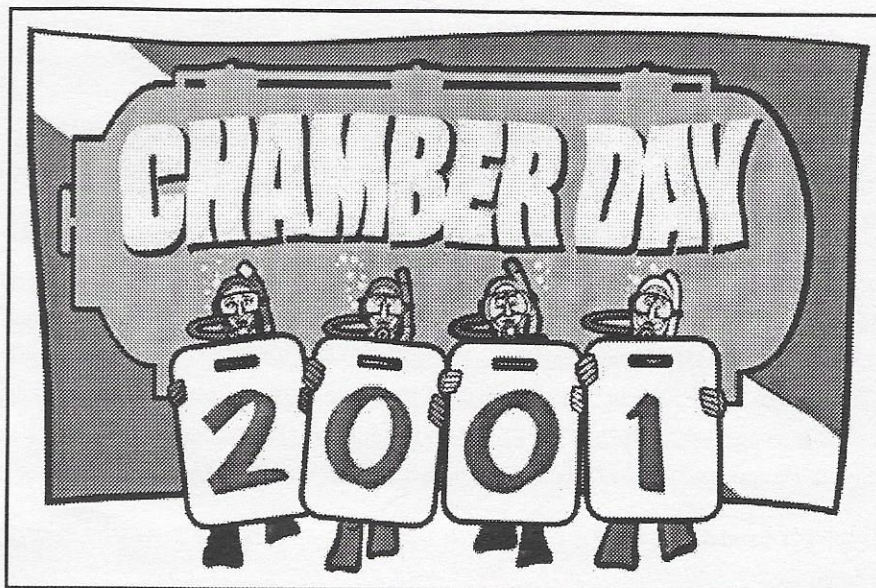

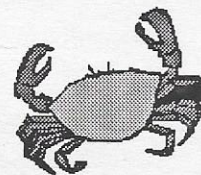
Crusty bread will be provided but bring your own beverages, other accompaniments, and a potluck if you are not into bouillabaisse!

**NEW FISH & GAME REGULATION CHANGES AFFECT SPORT DIVERS**

There are many new changes to the DFG regs for 2001. Actually, there are too many to cover here, and I'd probably need my lawyer to interpret them! But there are some items that will affect all divers who shoot fish.

The regulations detail several new marine Management Areas that affect the take of many fish, especially rockfish and lingcod. The important changes for divers are:

- **Sheephead:** the daily limit was reduced from 10 to 5 fish; there is now a 12 inch size minimum; although it appears that these can still be filleted on the boat, no fillet size is specified. I would make sure you have good size fillets if carving your fish on the boat; and don't forget to leave that patch of skin on.
- **Cabezon:** a new 15 inch minimum size is imposed; these **cannot** be filleted on the boat anymore.
- **Sculpin:** 10 inch minimum size.
- **Lingcod:** 26 inch minimum size.

There are a great many changes this year, and I recommend everyone who shoots fish go out and get a copy of the Regulations Booklet. Try your local bait shop or Harbor Patrol office. Supplements are already planned for May and June. Stay informed!

\*Prices are all inclusive (air, food, and beverages). Non-members add \$10 for single day and \$15 for two-day dives. New members paying full annual membership allowed one single day dive at approximately two-thirds of member price. Dive 01-C13 does not include air, food, and beverages. All dives except 01-C13 are limited load of 28 divers.

### Great Escape - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

### Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

### DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive.

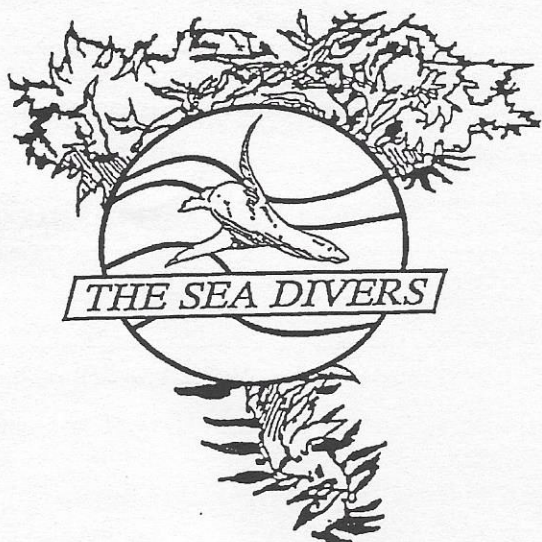
