

Our third two-day charter for the year is on the *Peace* to San Miguel Island. As is typical for our *Peace* two day dives we plan to head way west to San Miguel with possible dives at Santa Rosa on the way our and/or the way back. The pinnacles are always spectacular and club favorites. Over the past few years we have been very successful at Richardson's Rock, Boomerang, Skyscraper, Wilson Rock, Castle Rock, Egg Rock and Little Wilson. Weather permitting several of the pinnacles will feature on this charter. We made five on our May '01 charter.

Other great spots will include a selection on San Miguel from Bennett Point, Judith Rock, Tyler Bight, Wychoff Ledge, Simonton Cove and Harris Point. Potential spots at Santa Rosa will include South Point, Ford Point, Bechers Bay area and Talcott Shoal. As always we can tailor the choices based on weather and diver desires.

All of the areas should provide great opportunities for scallops and a variety of fish for the game takers and the very best for photography and/or video.

The food fare on the *Peace* is always outstanding and plentiful. The first day will provide heavy duty diving, for those so inclined, with up to 6 dives possible with a night dive for those still interested. The second day will be more leisurely with 3 or 4 dives anticipated. Dive spots will include areas suitable for intermediate divers and hopefully some of the more advanced spots covering the full range of diver desires and capabilities.

## DIVE THE YUKON

JOINT VENTURE WITH THE WRECK DIVERS

When: 29 September 2001- Departure 11:30 AM (Return 5:30 PM)

**Boat:** Lois Ann – West Mission Bay, San Diego Sea Diver Member Price: \$55 (includes food\* and air)

The Yukon is California's latest and most popular wreck, both in and outside of diving circles. It is different from nearly all other wrecks as it is completely intact, which also makes it one of California's most dangerous wrecks to dive.

Unlike most ships with large open holds for cargo, the *Yukon* was designed to carry a crew—its bulkheads and low decks form a maze of narrow passages and small compartments, some of which are over 50' from the nearest exit. To compound the potential danger, the ineffectual sinking of the *Yukon* left it on its portside, allowing sand and silt to fill the hull and block off several exits. The orientation of the ship is now offset by a strong list, increasing the depth from what was originally planned and the depths listed on the maps of the wreck.

Divers should be advised that entering the *Yukon* is no different than penetrating other wrecks or caves. Diving below an overhead environment is a **technical dive** and should only be attempted by those properly trained (use of thirds) and equipped (gear that includes a reel, redundant lighting and air sources).

The Yukon nearly experienced its first fatality on the day it was opened to the public when an *instructor* nearly lost his life. After 30 minutes of being trapped inside, he finally found his way out of the wreck and onto the sand. At 100 feet deep and 100 psi left in his tank, he dropped his weight belt and shot for the surface, negating his 10 minute decompression stop.

As a corporate sponsor of Project *Yukon*, the California Wreck Divers encourages and supports the use of shipwrecks for artificial reefs. However, we condone diver safety above all. When diving the *Yukon* or other wrecks, please exercise good judgement and caution.



We will be diving San Nic's North West reefs and high spots for monster bugs. Legend has it that when the bugs are as big as the boat they spew fire. In fact once upon a short time ago, one of these legendary monsters climbed atop the *Peace* diveboat while the boat was making the channel crossing from Nic to Talcott. The beast was aptly named "BugZilla" by second captain Bob McClurg who saw it first. Bob went out for a smoke one evening and the fire breathing lobster was climbing up the stern, it flamed Bob immediately and lit his cigarette too! Bob's hair was singed and some it still has not grown back. Captain Eric took quick action by tossing anything at hand at BugZilla. First went Roger's potato pancakes but BugZilla ate those faster than 28 divers ever could and simply returned another fire breathing belch. Sue Swindell jumped into the fray by trying to push it into the ocean, as if she thought it was it's birthday and it would simply let itself be pushed in like the rest of the crew. However, she narrowly missed it's menacing jaws and was only to be pushed back. She was held at bay in the galley by the beast's numerous legs. Next went Fidel's Boutique stash of shirts, patches and hats which where used to put out the small fires that were beginning to take hold on the boat. Finally from a dusty shoe box buried under charts and maps came ol' Capt. Bills "Rawhide" cassette tape. In the past this was played to get people off the boat and it worked well. Eric slammed the tape into a player, turned up the volume and watched as everyone cowered on the deck. BugZilla quivered, stumbled a bit, looked Eric square in the eyes with sad look of defeat then with a whoosh and a bit of steam fell back into the sea



from where it came. It was an incredible moment and who knows if that BugZilla will ever return again. Since then the "Rawhide" tape has not been played but is secretly stored for quick retrieval in an emergency like this. Because of the chaos of the moment photos were not taken however a rendering was made.

As you can see the stories and the bugs can get huge the farther out to sea you go. Especially when recanted from divers with advanced stages of narcosis. However, you can decide if legend is real and join us in a search for the BugZilla. If we don't find 'em at Nic then the next best spot we will look is Talcott. If BugZilla cannot be found on our adventure then we will take the women and children lobsters, leaving only the short ones. We will have an aggressive dive schedule. Gate times will be limited and we will get as many dives in as possible. Up to 9 dives the first day and 4 the second. If you are familiar with the *Peace* 

"Animal" trips then you should get the picture, the plan is the same. Dive early, dive often.

If you limit early the Lingcod and other game fish that are found at Nic and Talcott will keep your attention. For the Lobster, there were plenty 8+ pound bugs taken at Nic and Talcott during last year's season, the largest was over 10 lb. from Nic. Take a couple of days off and join us on a dive in search of BugZilla.

# **WRECKS & RIGS? NOT!**

Almost 30 divers were aboard the *Great Escape* on August 12 for the trip to the *Moody* and oil rigs. The skipper was quick to dispatch the anchor at the *Moody*, and the day started with little current and a good 20 to 25 feet of visibility. Divers scrambled overboard, some with huge double tanks, some with Nitrox, one with a single 160! We all found the anchor draped over the bow section (at least most of us did!) and by all accounts, everyone was pleased with the 2 jumps made on the *Moody*. The skipper announced that the oil rigs were closed for the day; a decision was made to head for the *Olympic*. Rumors from the first divers down here about another wreck found off a reel left on the bottom conjured up visions of new goodies to be had. Unfortunately, it turned out to be the very tip of the *Olympic*'s bow that was "refound"! As the *Olympic* fishing barge had sunk as it lay at anchor, there are great piles of chain both at the bow and at the stern. There are also large rocky reefs at both the bow and stern, which sometimes gives the diver a very different perspective of this gargantuan of Southern California shipwrecks.

We found ourselves back at the dock early in the day, well stocked on food and nitrogen.....

# WELL...!

The good news was we made San Nicolas on our July two day. The bad news was we made San Nicolas on our July two day. The attempted run at Begg Rock was thwarted during the night due to unanticipated rough water and increasing winds. The net result was a series of less than great dives on the South side of San Nicolas between the East End and the mid-point of the island. The furthest West we got was the no-name wreck. All in all there were six dives mostly in choppy, surgey, windy, 20-25 foot visibility and 53°-55°F conditions. Maximum depths were in the 75 feet region. Skies were overcast.

We partially overnighted in Dutch Harbor, then pulled anchor about 2:30 AM and headed for Farnsworth Banks where conditions were vastly improved. Some swells but minimal wind and chop and warm sun fairly early. The shallower pinnacles were already taken so Tim B. settled for a portion of the reef at 90 feet or so. Visibility was around 50 feet with water temperature in the low 60's. Really nice dive with large stands of purple coral. We moved around the West End to Black Rock and then to Eagle Reef. Conditions were flat, no surge, visibility around 50 feet and no current. We made one dive at Black Rock and two at Eagle Reef. By now the sun was hot with little or no cloud cover.

Not per plan, not even close, but a nice recovery on the second day. We assumed it was still windy back at San Nicolas!! The boat and crew did a nice job for us and although disappointed most of us enjoyed the two days. Beats working anytime!!



# INFORMATION FOR SOUTH BAY DIVERS REGARDING MARINE PROTECTED AREAS (MPA'S)

As you are probably now aware, the Department of Fish and Game is putting together plans that include declaring some 10 to 15% of the California coast as "No-take zones". Also, as you can imagine, the areas chosen in the preliminary draft plan include the best and most accessible near-shore areas for divers. Included are Leo Carrillo State Beach, Pt. Fermin, and the area between Flat Rock Pt. and Pt. Vincente on Palos Verdes. Other "No-take zones" are being established at Catalina West end, Farnsworth Bank, and throughout the islands and along the coast. There is still time to express your opinions and change the plan. In order to be effective, comments submitted to the Department should include alternate suggestions to preliminary closed areas.

### SPECIFIC INFORMATION ON LUNADA BAY AND PT. FERMIN RESERVES

The proposed "No-take zones" for Palos Verdes extend between Flat Rock Pt. and Pt. Vincente on the North, and from Pt. Fermin past Cabrillo Beach on the South. The area between Flat Rock and Palos Verdes Pt. is one of the most lush, most fish-populated areas along the entire south coast of California. It has an extremely healthy population of lobsters, thanks to the fact that commercial trapping has been restricted from there for many years. These new proposed reserves will exclude hunting activities for divers who depend on shore access, as well as boaters who visit from nearby King Harbor or LA Harbor.

# **Suggested Alternatives:**

- 1. Leave these areas open for the taking of lobster, and specifically allow within the Reserve the possession of fin fish taken outside the 1000 ft outer boundary for the benefit of free divers utilizing shore access, **OR**
- 2. Instead of proposed Lunada Bay and Pt. Fermin areas, make the coast from Portuguese Pt. to Pt. Fermin a Reserve. This alternative area is less accessible, contains much of the same underwater terrain as the proposed areas, and has poorer visibility. It is further from the marinas adjacent to Palos Verdes. Although this new area may be regarded as a "second choice" area, we feel that some "second choice" and even some "third choice" areas should be included in the MPA plan in lieu of impounding all "first choice" areas from the dive community.

Divers are the only user group affected by these near-shore closures! Fishermen are basically unaffected, since there is very little shore fishing in these areas, and boat fishermen stay outside the 1000 ft outer boundary. It is up to us to keep these areas open!

# Great Escape - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

### Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

# DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.

B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.

For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.

If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the


