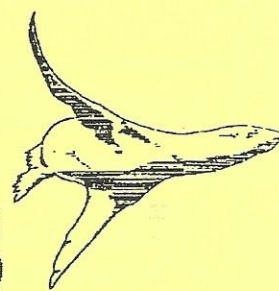

OCTOBER GENERAL MEETING DAHLIA SOSA - NITROX DIVING

Our October General Meeting will feature Dahlia Sosa on the advantages and disadvantages of Nitrox diving. Dahlia has been diving since 1993 and has averaged 200 dives per year. She currently has ~ 1600 dives in a wide variety of locations and experience levels and became an instructor in 1998 and a Nitrox Instructor shortly thereafter. She has made approximately 600 Nitrox dives to date and teaches the class on a regular basis.

Dahlia's talk will be an interactive presentation. She will present an outline of Nitrox diving including a definition of Nitrox, the difference between recreational and technical Nitrox diving and goals, purposes and clear benefits of Nitrox, Nitrox safety, plus other related information. The intent is to engage in an spontaneous dialogue amongst the people present and to resolve any myths or misconceptions.

Our next General Meeting is on Tuesday 2 October at Round Table Pizza in Hawthorne starting at 7:00 PM.

More World Class diving for us all! Tanner Bank and Cortes Bank, both on one trip on *Great Escape*!!

Both Banks are near the Mexican border and are typically deep dives, especially Tanner Bank. They are 70 to 80 miles SSW of 22nd Street Landing and about 35 to 40 miles SW of China Point on San Clemente Island and roughly west of San Diego. As exposed dive spots, they are not dived as much as other Southern California areas.

Tanner Bank is a deep 100 feet plus plateau and is known for its large red, pink, and purple hydrocoral formations, large fish, especially rockfish and cabezon. Schools of tuna, yellowtail and other species are not uncommon. This is definitely one of the most spectacular and unusual dives in Southern California. The club has not dived Tanner in many years, so this is your opportunity.

Cortes Bank is closer to the Mexican border and offers excellent diving. In addition to the large variety of fish, Cortes is home to a substantial lobster population, many of which can be found inside the wreck of the *Abalonia*. Much less of a plateau than Tanner, it provides a greater variety of walls, crevices, plateaus, and some shallower depths at 30 feet or so.

Photo and video oriented divers will not be disappointed with the dive locations, especially Tanner Bank. Just cruising out there adds to the two days, especially if the sun graces us with its presence.

This dive is a strong intermediate to advance dive due to the full exposure of both Banks to the ocean. However, relative beginners can make the dives, assuming ocean conditions relative to waves, surge and current are within the individual's capabilities. San Clemente will be our fallback, which is typically suitable for all skill levels. Consult the divemaster if in doubt about your capability versus observed conditions.

These are really outstanding dive areas. Chances to dive here are limited. For sign-ups call Curt (Billings) at (909) 945-3461, Fax at (909) 477-2746 or e-mail at curt@diver.net. GREAT DIVING!

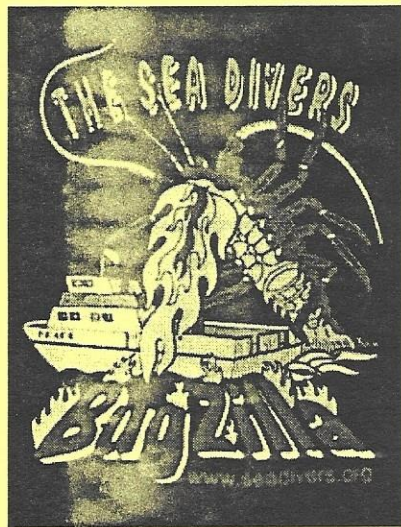

We will be diving San Nic's North West reefs and high spots for monster bugs. Legend has it that when the bugs are as big as the boat they spew fire. In fact once upon a short time ago, one of these legendary monsters climbed atop the *Peace* diveboat while the boat was making the channel crossing from Nic to Talcott. The beast was aptly named "BugZilla" by second captain Bob McClurg who saw it first. Bob went out for a smoke one evening and the fire breathing lobster was climbing up the stern, it flamed Bob immediately and lit his cigarette too! Bob's hair was singed and some it still has not grown back. Captain Eric took quick action by tossing anything at hand at BugZilla. First went Roger's potato pancakes but BugZilla ate those faster than 28 divers ever could and simply returned another fire breathing belch. Sue Swindell jumped into the fray by trying to push it into the ocean, as if she thought it was it's birthday and it would simply let itself be pushed in like the rest of the crew. However, she narrowly missed it's menacing jaws and was only to be pushed back. She was held at bay in the galley by the beast's numerous legs. Gate times will be limited and we will get as many dives in as possible. Up to 9 dives the first day and 4 the second. If you are familiar with the *Peace*

"Animal" trips then you should get the picture, the plan is the same. Dive early, dive often.

If you limit early the Lingcod and other game fish that are found at Nic and Talcott will keep your attention. For the Lobster, there were plenty 8+ pound bugs taken at Nic and Talcott during last year's season, the largest was over 10 lb. from Nic. Take a couple of days off and join us on a dive in search of BugZilla.

PEACE OF ACTION

Great food, outstanding crew, excellent diving and a free live sex show. What more could anyone ask for from a dive trip?

What you say?? You MISSED it?!?! Well, chances are you did as the September two-day on the *Peace* was W-A-Y undersubscribed with only a total of 16 divers showing up on the boat. This of course made for quite spacious and luxurious accommodations for the passengers, a non-stressful trip for the crew and significant heartburn for the Club Treasury.

We spent both days at San Miguel under overcast skies. The ocean was extremely flat with never any currents at depth. Some of the more navigationally negligent divers did have the opportunity for marathon swims due to the occasional surface currents.

We dove all the major pinnacles including Wilson Rock, Boomerang, Castle Rock Foul Area, Richardson's Rock and Skyscraper. The conditions at the pinnacles were some of the best I've even seen - especially at Richardson's which is typically a quite dark and gloomy dive in the early AM. Visibility was generally good in the 40-50 foot range except on some dives where a heavy krill population clouded the water. Temperatures ranged from a very comfortable 57° to a downright chilly gottagetinthejacuzzi 49°. Additional dives were done in the shallows for the halibut hunters under similar conditions.

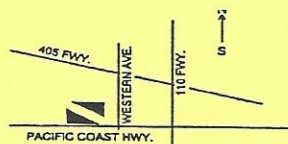
...and then there were the whales! Prior to the first dive on Friday AM we came within 50 yards of a whale eating his (her?) breakfast of krill about a mile from Wilson Rock. The resident whale expert was asleep so we did not get confirmation on whether it was a humpback or a blue. On Saturday as we were moving to our last dive spot we spotted a couple of whales and moved in closer. After awhile they started chasing each other at incredible speeds and a third whale appeared. They did circles and figure eights, running on their sides with one fin and half their tails out of the water. On several occasions they came within 15 feet of the boat! These were very large blue whales in a mating ritual. The speed and dexterity of these gigantic animals was truly amazing to see. Picture a locomotive being able to run on an Indy race car track at race car speeds and you get the idea. Even the crew had never experienced anything like it. We watched them for at least an hour and even had more blues show up in the area. As usually happens, no one had a video camera but I don't think anyone that was there will forget it. The Discovery Channel would kill for footage of what we saw.

There were no significant boobies. The only ones I wrote down were Dean A. for "The Great TV Incident" which went to prove a man is lost without a remote and Eric S. for not connecting his air hose to his dry suit and subsequently dumping ice water into the suit when he hit the purge button underwater.

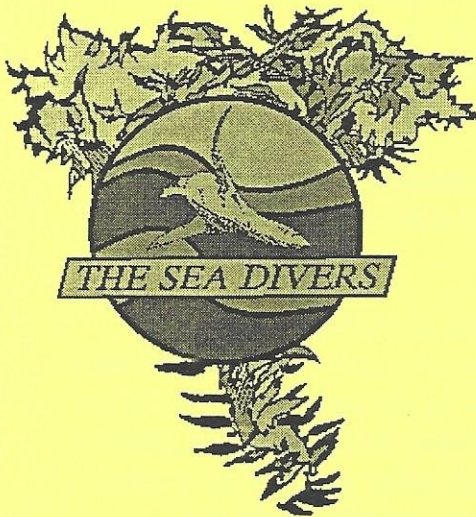
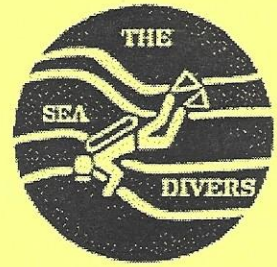

INCREASED SECURITY REQUIREMENTS FOR PASSENGER CARRYING VESSELS

Dear T-Boat Owner/Operator:

The U.S. Coast Guard Captain of the Port (COTP) Los Angeles-Long Beach has implemented extra security measures affecting all small passenger vessels operating in this Area of Responsibility (AOR).

The COTP is requiring all passenger ticketing offices and landings to check passengers' picture identification prior to ticket issuance and boarding. The COTP is also requiring each vessel operator to ensure all baggage, coolers, and miscellaneous containers have been physically examined prior to being placed on board the vessel.

Offices and facilities handling large numbers of passengers should also consider increasing the number of security personnel on the property to identify suspicious activities.

Please report any suspicious persons or activity to the U.S. Coast Guard Marine Safety Office/Group Los Angeles-Long Beach Communications Center at (310) 732-2043 and select option "0" to speak with watch standing personnel.

Your assistance and cooperation in this matter is vital to the safety and security of our port. This order will remain in effect until further notice.

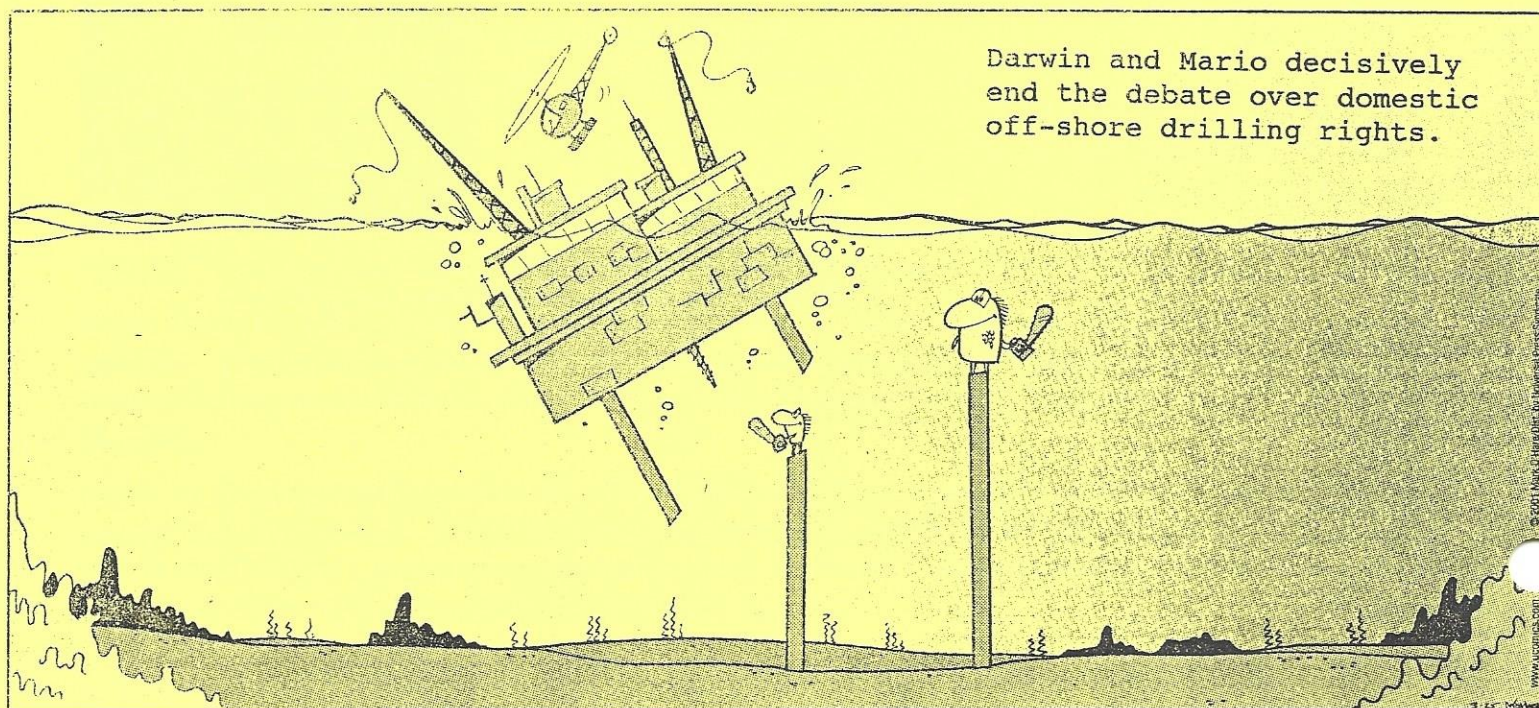
I have received input from several members and have incorporated some of them where practical. I would like any input on:

*Prices are all inclusive (air, food, and beverages). Non-members add \$10 for single day and \$15 for two-day dives. New members paying full annual membership allowed one single day dive at approximately two-thirds of member price. Dive 01-C13 does not include air, food, and beverages. All dives except 01-C13 are limited load of 28 divers.

Great Escape - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the

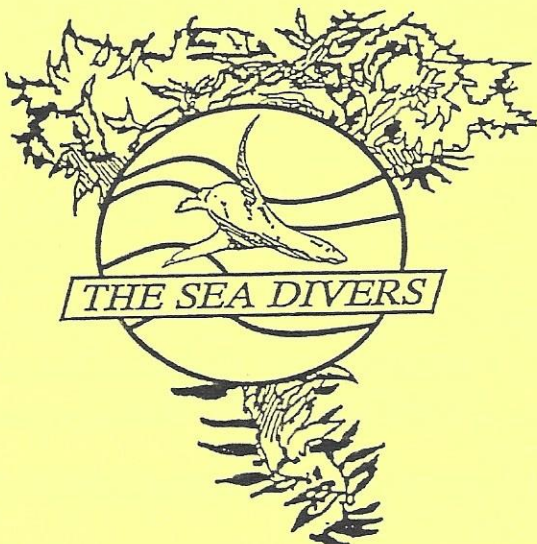
