FROM THE EXECUTIVE FEEDBACK...

On our 2 February 02 dive to San Clemente backside, several divers expressed some disappointment in that we were only able to make three dives. There were several contributing factors. We had relatively leisurely gate times and several divers entered the water near the end of the gate time and made relatively long dives. The gate times we can control and hold tighter, especially the first dive. However, it is incumbent on all of us, when planning or anticipating a relatively long dive, to be at the gate near the opening rather than near the closing. Obviously surface time can be and issue, however, if you plan to make all the dives, burning up all your bottom time early would seem to defeat the desire for a four dive day, especially on the longer single day trips such as the subject dive and our next trip to San Nicolas. We anticipate invoking tighter gate times but that will only help if we are collectively in sync with each other to maximize the number of dives. We certainly need a balance between Marine style extremes and a leisurely day of diving. Any input and/or opinions on the subject are solicited.

MARCH GENERAL MEETING JIM HARLAN - UNCOMMON ADVENTURES



The lobster season, once more, is drawing to a close. This limited load charter is on *Great Escape* out of 22nd Street, San Pedro. We will arrive at San Nicolas just after first light and although not early enough for a full night dive it will be dark down there so be sure to bring a good light and a backup. We have made San Nicolas on most attempts on the *Great Escape*.

Our primary targets on this trip are bugs and there still are a few biggies out there. Perseverance is the key, as all great bug warriors will tell you. For those of us that are not so lucky, fast enough, or skilled at the lobster stakes, scallops are an alternative and fish provide yet another alternative with many different species to spear. Although not the prettiest underwater environment, San Nicolas can provide excellent opportunities for video or photography.

Diving around San Nicolas is suitable for all skill levels with ocean cooperation. If not sure of dive conditions, check with the divemaster before making a deep or potentially difficult dive. Bunks and staterooms will be pre-assigned on a first pay/space available basis. SAN NICOLAS IT IS...DON'T WAIT, LIMITED LOAD and the last chance for bugs this season! The third dive of our 2002 program is to Santa Barbara Island and Sutil Island and should provide some great diving. We continue our excellent relationship with the *Great Escape* and hope to have an excellent trip for all, especially with our limited load scenario.

As most of you experienced divers know, Santa Barbara diving provides the very best in underwater topography, marine life, and generally high visibility. Sea lions abound and are always ready to "play". Black sea bass have been sighted on numerous occasions as have relatively large rays sometimes in "flying formations". The reefs are ideal for photography, video, or just looking. Typically, we will circumnavigate this relatively small island to pick off four or five choice spots, including one or two in the environs of Sutil Island.

For the game takers there are a variety of fish and scallops as mentioned above. Diving conditions in April are usually pleasant and typically the ocean is cooperative. This dive is suitable for all skill levels. Relative beginners should check with the divermaster to ascertain the specifics of each dive. *Great Escape* is one of the largest dive boats in the L.A. area and provides an extremely comfortable diving platform. The "verandah" (a.k.a. sun deck) also provides for sun and relaxation on the ride home. THIS WAS FEBRUARY ???

Near flat clam, no current, 30 to 50 feet visibility, 57°-58° water temperature under clear blue skies and warm sun, on the backside of San Clemente in February! I wouldn't have bet on that nor the New England Patriots on the next day!!

We made three dives under these trying conditions. The first at (or near) Swiss Cheese on a great reef structure including purple coral. Depths were to 80 feet and the bugs were there especially the three-and-three-sixteenths variety. The second spot, named in real time as "Allen's Secret Spot", about a half mile south east of the first spot, turned out to be great, if you went in the "right" direction and not so great if you didn't. Depths were to 70 feet at the sand at the bottom of a 30 to 40 foot wall. The third and last dive was in the Windmill area a mile or two south of West Cove. Visibility was outstanding at 50 feet plus, with depths to 40 feet or so.

Gate times and relatively long dives precluded a fourth dive so we headed back to 22^{nd} Street. The run back was calm and uneventful and we arrived back at the dock around 6 PM. We awarded two booby prizes. The first to Eric S. for not grabbing lobster in a "glory hole" cave as he had no fishing license (we did!!!) and for diving a dry suit wet. The second went to Brian K. who managed to drop his 35 lb. weight belt in thick kelp causing his buddy, the diversater and others significant grief in recovering same.

Just a fantastic weather day, great diving and exceptional food and support from *Great Escape*, Capt. Tim and the crew. The BBQ'd ribs were excellent. Nice trip.





CHAMBER DAY / EVE 2002 Wednesday, 1 May



The daytime event is known as "Chamber Day" and runs as it has in the past. Fourteen of the SoCal dive boats are donating their services for the day. They are (in alphabetical order): Bottom Scratcher, Cee Ray, Encore, Great Escape, Horizon, Iron Eagle, Island Time, Magician, Mr. C, Pacific Star, Psalty V, Sea Bass, Sundiver, and Westerly.

In addition to these boats, for those of you who can't take off for the day but would still like to participate, we have the *Flying Dutchman*. As you know, the *Flying Dutchman* is a mythical boat that sails the oceans for eternity without ever coming into port. So what better choice for those who can't dive than a boat that doesn't really exist? Those who sign up for the *Flying Dutchman* will receive raffle tickets like everyone else, and a special Chamber Day t-shirt that says "I dove the *Flying Dutchman* on Chamber Day 2002", available only to those who sign up for this boat.

Here's the way the daytime event works:

You pay \$75 for the day (all the proceeds go to the Chamber) and choose the boat you want to go on. Book early because once a boat fills, it's unavailable - no waiting lists. Although we'll hold a reservation for you for 72 hours, after that time, spots are only guaranteed when they are paid in full. In general, the boats (except for the *Dutchman*) will leave the dock at 7AM and head for Catalina. You'll get a commemorative Chamber Day 2002 t-shirt, a shot at prizes in the onboard raffle each boat will conduct, five raffle tickets (you can buy more on your boat or at the Chamber), and two dives at Catalina.

Sometime during the day, your boat will stop at our Catalina Hyperbaric Chamber in Big Fisherman's Cove. You'll all disembark for a 75-minute overview of Chamber operations. L.A. County Lifeguards will explain their job, rescue helicopters and crews from the Coast Guard and Sheriffs will be on hand, and the Chamber crew will show you the Chamber itself

We realize that not everyone can take a Wednesday off, so that's why we have Chamber Evening. What makes this event unique is that we secure the ENTIRE Aquarium of the Pacific in Long Beach . . . just for us.

The Aquarium, along with the Chamber Day Committee, invites you for an evening of food, fish, and fun, also on Wednesday, May 1, from 7:15-11:00PM. And we have a fabulous feast planned. We'll have four cash bars going and free munchies from when the doors open until the serving of dinner around 8:15PM. Dinner is a sit-down affair (dress is casual group tables are assigned, non-group is open seating). You start you off with a lovely bed of fresh garden greens served with a light vinaigrette dressing. This is followed by a sumptuous chicken Marsala served over a bed of rice and accompanied by a vegetable medley of sliced carrots and string beans. CERTIFIED DIVERS ENJOY FREE AQUARIUM ADMISSION ON MARCH 17, 2002

WHAT:

The Aquarium of the Pacific will celebrate its first annual Divers' Day featuring free admission for certified divers, booths from various marine and dive related organizations, live equipment demonstrations and more. To enjoy free admission, divers must present valid proof of certification with photo I.D., and the public may also enjoy this event with regular admission.

The California Classic Equipment Divers will feature antique diving equipment and will perform demonstration dives of the US Navy MK V hardhat diving rig. The Historical Diving Society, the Catalina Chamber, California Diving News and a host of other organizations will feature displays and booths underneath the Aquarium's 88-foot blue whale model in the Great Hall of the Pacific.

In addition to all of the Divers' Day festivities, guests can enjoy:

Pacific Galleries: The Aquarium will take visitors on a journey through the Pacific Ocean, the largest and most diverse body of water, to meet over 12,000 ocean animals representing more than 550 species. Guests will explore three galleries featuring 18 major habitats and 31 exhibits focusing on the waters of Southern California/Baja, Tropical Pacific and Northern Pacific. On their journey, they will encounter seals, sea lions, sea otters, sharks and more.

Lorikeet Forest Exhibit: The fun continues as guests encounter Lorikeet Forest, the Aquarium's new 5,200 sq. ft. walkthrough aviary filled with dozens of brightly colored lorikeet birds. These friendly birds will land on your arm, shoulders and even head to get a sip of nectar from your hand-held nectar cup.

Jellies: Phantoms of the Deep: *Jellies: Phantoms of the Deep* is back by popular demand through December 31, 2002, and guests will enjoy learning about sea jellies—mysterious creatures with no heart, brain or eyes. Exhibit features more than one dozen species of sea jelly.

Weedy Sea Dragon Exhibit Visitors have the opportunity to see weedy sea dragons, which are native to Australia and resemble the plants found in their local waters. The Aquarium of the Pacific is the first aquarium in the world to successfully breed these delicate creatures.

^{*}Prices are all inclusive (air, food, and beverages). Non-members add \$10 for single day and \$15 for two-day dives. New members paying full annual membership allowed one single day dive at approximately two-thirds of member price. Free Diver price is 75% of full price. Bubblewatchers price is 50% of full price. Dive 02-C14 does not include air, food, and beverages. All dives except 02-C14 and 02-10 are limited load of 28 divers. Dive 02-10 (a.k.a. Bugzilla) is a limited load of 24 divers.

Great Escape - 22nd Street Landing

South on Harbor freeway, left on Gaffey, left on 22nd Street, down the hill and park in designated areas.

Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may, but is not required to, have a boat deposit on file with the club. A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits will be considered as payment in full.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 5 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 30 days prior to the dive to be confirmed. Dive boat deposits may be used as part of the payment in full.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

If a diver has a deposit on file with the club and uses that deposit to secure a reservation on a boat dive, he may not use that deposit to secure additional dives until he has paid the club for the first dive. Two years after a diver has ceased to be a member of the club, his unclaimed dive boat deposit will be forfeited to the club. Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the


