#### FROM THE EXECUTIVE OPINION...

As most of you are aware, oil rigs *Eureka*, *Elly* and *Ellen* have been closed to diving for nearly a year. Recently, owners Aera Energy, reluctantly agreed to have divers back in the vicinity of their rigs (platforms). They requested a strict but simple protocol for sport diving activities. We dived *Eureka* on 11 August '02 using and abiding by the Aera Energy protocol with no problems. Apparently not all charter boats and/or divers are following the requirements as stated by Aero Energy below:

Subject: Diving Aera Energy's Rigs

In reference to the below notice, over the past weeks Aera Energy LLC's Beta operations at platforms Ellen, Elly and Eureka has experienced a number of incidences where dive boats and divers have either failed to notify our Control Room regarding planned dive activities, or have failed to honor our requests to stay clear of certain areas where marine operations were taking place. In each of these cases, these actions have placed both divers and Aera personnel at increased risk. Due to these events, Aera wishes to again advise the diving community of our strong preference that diving activities not take place in the vicinity of the platforms and, if continued disregard persists for any aspects of our prior communication, or compromises the safety of our operations, Aera will take further steps to limit or prevent future diving activity in the area.

Aera respectfully requests that this notice be forwarded to other dive businesses that may be active in the area and that may not have received our previous notice. Thank you.

World Class diving for us all to Tanner Bank and Cortes Bank, both on one trip on Great Escape!!

Both Banks are near the Mexican border and are typically deep dives, especially Tanner Bank. They are 70 to 80 miles SSW of Long Beach and about 35 to 40 miles SW of China Point on San Clemente Island and roughly west of San Diego. As exposed dive spots, they are not dived as much as other Southern California areas.

Tanner Bank is a deep 100 feet plus plateau and is known for its large red, pink, and purple hydrocoral formations, large fish, especially rockfish and cabezon. Schools of tuna, yellowtail and other species are not uncommon. This is definitely one of the most spectacular and unusual dives in Southern California. The club had not dived Tanner in many years, until last year when conditions were perfect!

Cortes Bank is closer to the Mexican border and offers excellent diving. In addition to the large variety of fish, Cortes is home to a substantial lobster population, many of which can be found inside the wreck of the *Abalonia*. Much less of a plateau than Tanner, it provides a greater variety of walls, crevices, plateaus, and some shallower depths at 30 feet or so. We made five dives at Cortes last year.

Photo and video oriented divers will not be disappointed with the dive locations, especially Tanner Bank. Just cruising out there adds to the two days, especially if the Sun graces us with it's presence.

This dive is a strong intermediate to advance dive due to the full exposure of both Banks to the ocean. However, relative beginners can make the dives, assuming ocean conditions relative to waves, surge and current are within the individual's capabilities. San Clemente will be our fallback, which is typically suitable for all skill levels. Consult the diversaster if in doubt about your capability versus observed conditions.

# ALL KINDS OF CONDITIONS

Our September two-day on the *Peace* was beset with a varaiety of very unusual weather and ocean conditions. The remnants of a tropical storm off Baja and a major southerly loop of the jet stream brought warm and humid weather to Southern California. In addition the storm generated 6-8 foot swells were coming from the South.


We left the dock a little after 1:00 AM and headed for Scorpion Anchorage on the North-East tip of Santa Cruz Island, where we anchored for several hours. At dawn, an attempt further North and West proved too rough and we looped around finishing up at the North side of Anacapa!! To say the least the weather was weird, with strong winds from the Northwest whipping up white caps and rain approaching. Also currents were running high off both ends of the island. We tucked in at about mid-island over White Rock Reef. Diving was fair to good with depths to 100 feet, 62°F temperature and 30 to 35 feet visibility. We then moved to the South side where the southerly swells were finally subsiding. We anchored at Parallel Reefs in about 80 feet of water. Much calmer than dive one as we were sheltered by the island but the water temperature dropped about 10°F and visibility dropped to 25 feet. The third and last dive at Anacapa was just inside the West End on the North side. Nice dive! Visibility at about 30 feet, slight current, depths to 50 feet on the inside and 62°F temperature.

Eric B. decided to plough back to Scorpion Anchorage. Some waves pretty much came over the boat but we finally made it. We made two dives at Scorpion trying to figure out what next. Scorpion was calm, no current on the inside, windy, depths to 50 feet and 30 feet visibility in 62°F water. We overnighted on the South side of Santa Cruz at Albert Arch.

Saturday, at about dawn, we began a run to Gull Island. The air temperature had dropped 30°F (!!!) but the sun was rising into totally clear skies, a major change from Friday's tropical overcast. We anchored to the West of Gull, which apart from the incessant wind was a nice spot. The water temperature was 53°F (?!?!), depths to 75 feet, 50 feet visibility, no current and thick kelp. We then moved maybe 250-350 yards to the South side of Gull. Unbelievable difference, with a raging current from East to West. The boat also hung weird on the anchor, with the wind overpowering the current causing the anchor line to pull way to the East (starboard) at almost 45° and away from the bow gate. Most of us decided that this would be no fun at all and elected to sit this one out. Of those that went in ALL had problems swimming to the anchor line. Some made it through shear energy, some using kelp that had wrapped around the anchor line, one using a hastily rigged current line (a.k.a. "Peter's Cheater Line") and one didn't!! All in all it was quite entertaining for the rest of us. Through a variety of techniques all returned safely to the boat, with comments and mini-stories regarding the severity of the current.

Time for some less challenging conditions, so we moved to Albert Anchorage and subsequently to a cove just North of San Pedro Point on the East side. Both dives were in calm, 63°F water, depths to 50 feet or so, visibility at about 30 feet, no current, warm sun and comfortable for all! The run back started out fairly rough with a slow calming as we worked East towards Ventura Marina, where we docked a little after 5:00 PM.

Under the weird circumstances the *Peace* and it's crew did a great job. Food was excellent and varied and all in all we enjoyed the trip despite not making the San Miguel Pinnacles!

- 5. During the day, keep your gear spread out as much as possible, so that no one can sit in front of your gear. If you want to sit down, sit in front of someone else's gear (you can always find some "neatnik" who keeps his space tidy.) After all, you're paying good money for the trip, so you deserve all the space you can get.

- 6. When you sit down wearing your tank, don't worry about some other guy's mask or computer. They are built to take rough handling. Besides, if they are concerned about their gear, they shouldn't leave it unprotected. After all, you're paying good money for the trip, so you deserve to take all the space you can get.
- 7. If you sit out a dive, go stand at the exit gate so you can watch other divers' techniques, and chat with them as they prepare to jump in. After all, you're paying good money for the trip, so you deserve all the consideration you can get.
- 8. At roll call after dives, always make the Divemaster shout your name (or number) at least three times. That way, everyone will get to know who you are. After all, you're paying good money for the trip, so you deserve all the personal service you can get.
- 9. All Dive Boat cooks and "Galley Gals" like to be teased and kidded. Ask for things they don't have, or ask for things that are right in front of you. After all, you're paying good money for the trip, so you deserve all the service you can get.
- 10. You're probably paying good money for the trip, don't get suckered into tipping the crew. They probably make more money than you do, and they have a better job than you do, too. After all, you're paying good money for the trip, so you deserve all you can get.



Subject: Beta diving protocol

Mr. Kurtis:

Aera Energy LLC (Aera) recognizes the time and energy you have put into trying to work out a mutually satisfactory protocol for allowing divers to dive in the vicinity of Aera's platforms Ellen, Elly and Eureka located off Long Beach in federal waters. While we appreciate your efforts in this matter, Aera's utmost concern is the fact that there is currently a Security Alert on the West Coast in force as directed by the FBI. Due to this alert, for security and safety concerns Aera believes the best solution is to not have any diving activity in the area. However, should you or your own company proceed with such activities, Aera would appreciate it if you and your company would take the following steps:

- 1) Aera's platform Control Room (714/969-3511) will appreciate being notified 24 72 hours in advance when a dive is to occur in the vicinity of Aera's platforms. Please provide all information regarding the number of divers, the specific location of the dives, the days and times the dives are to take place, and any other information that may be helpful in monitoring the dives.
- 2) Aera's facilities are posted as NO TRESPASSING and we expect all divers to stay off of all portions of the physical platform structures, both above and below the water line. Aera considers the harvesting of shellfish from the platform structures by recreational personnel to be a trespassing violation.
- 3) All divers should be advised that they are diving at their sole risk.
- 4) Given Aera's position regarding diving in the vicinity of our platforms, Aera will not participate in the ad-hoc committee you have proposed for reviewing dive procedures. In the future, I request that you please contact me at the below phone or e-mail address as the Aera focal point for any further issues regarding these matters.

Again, due to security and safety concerns, we hope you understand our position in this matter.

To All Parties Interested in California's Nearshore Fishery

The August 2002 version of the proposed Nearshore Fishery Management Plan has been completed. Two new sections have been added to this version of the proposed Nearshore Fishery Management Plan. These two new sections are Section IV, entitled "NFMP Comments and Response to Comments," and Section V, entitled "Clarification and Corrections." Sections I, II and III remain the same as in the May 9, 2002 version of the proposed Nearshore Fishery Management Plan except as noted in Section V.

Section IV contains the public comments received on the Nearshore Fishery Management Plan from May 9, 2002 through June 29, 2002. Over 500 comments were received on the May 9, 2002 version of the proposed NFMP. The Department, on behalf of the Fish and Game Commission (Commission), prepared written responses to all these public comments submitted to the Commission regarding the proposed Nearshore Fishery Management Plan. Section IV has been issued as a separate covered document. The Commission will consider all comments on the proposed Nearshore Fishery Management Plan, and is scheduled to adopt the plan at its August 29, 2002 meeting in Oakland.

Section V contains clarifications and corrections that were identified by Department staff or addressed in public comments. The Initial Statement of Reasons for Regulatory Action and the proposed regulatory language in Section III of the May 9, 2002 version of the Nearshore Fishery Management Plan has been deleted. The revised Initial Statement of Reasons for Regulatory Action and the proposed regulatory language has been added to Section V. Technical and non-substantiative corrections were also made to the table of contents, list of tables, list of figures, and acknowledgments within Section I.

The August 2002 version of the proposed Nearshore Fishery Management Plan will be available at Department of Fish and Game offices (please see the enclosed list of locations and contact information). I appreciate your interest in and concern for California's nearshore resources.

<sup>\*</sup>Prices are all inclusive (air, food, and beverages). Non-members add \$10 for single day and \$15 for two-day dives. New members paying full annual membership allowed one single day dive at approximately two-thirds of member price. Free Diver price is 75% of full price. Bubblewatchers price is 50% of full price. Dive 02-C14 does not include air, food, and beverages. All dives except 02-C14 and 02-10 are limited load of 28 divers. Dive 02-10 (a.k.a. Bugzilla) is a limited load of 24 divers.

#### Great Escape - Long Beach Sportfishing, Berth 55

South on 710 freeway, exit at Pico off ramp, thru light, right at first driveway past traffic signal. Park in "Sportfishing Parking" after unloading car.

#### Peace - Ventura Marina

North on Ventura freeway to Victoria Ave. in Ventura. Turn left onto Victoria and continue to Olivas Park Drive. Turn right and continue all the way down toward the beach and across Harbor Drive, go to the left onto Spinnaker Drive. Look for Milano's Italian Restaurant and turn right into the parking area. If you get to the end of Spinnaker, turn around and take the second left. Park adjacent to the berth (Slip #20) to unload, then park overnight in the last row adjacent to Spinnaker Drive.

#### DIVE BOAT POLICY

A club member may make a reservation on an upcoming dive as follows:

- A) Unconfirmed reservations may be made for any boat dive at any time. To confirm a reservation, payment in full must be received.
- B) For single day dives, divers holding an unconfirmed reservation will be called 3 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 15 days prior to the dive to be confirmed.
- C) For two day dives, divers holding unconfirmed reservations will be called 4 weeks prior to the dive and advised that payment in full is required no later than 21 days prior to the dive to be confirmed.
- D) If payment in full is not received by the deadline, the diver may be replaced by a wait listed diver who has paid in full.
- E) Pre-assignment of bunks will be made on a first paid basis for selected dives.
- F) Executive Officers and club members who annually support at least one third of Sea Diver charters may pay on the boat but must get prior approval from the Dive Boat Reservationist or the Club President.

Any reservation may be cancelled two weeks prior to a dive with a full refund. Cancellations will not be accepted within two weeks prior to the dive unless a diver holding a reservation can sell or transfer their reservation to another qualified diver. The dive reservationist will assist in this process, but is not responsible for providing paying alternates. When confirmation is received by the dive boat reservationist that a cancelling diver is being replaced by another qualified diver, the replacement diver is then fully responsible for the cost of the dive.

Only club members of The Sea Divers and members of other selected clubs may make boat dive reservations prior to one month before a scheduled boat dive. Partial refunds from single day boats which do not make the advertised dive location will be passed on to members who request them within two weeks of the dive


